Serious Accident to a Boy.

The Wasatch Home states that last Tuesday Dan, Rollins, aged 17, the son of Dan, Rollins, was seriously injured by being struck in the head by a horse. He was returning from Park City with a boy about the same age as himself. They had one horse between them and the horse they were riding while his companion was leading the horse. They were coming down a steep hill and the boy behind him lost his balance and tumbled under the horse's heels and frightened the animal, which lunged forward and struck the boy in front—but not seriously injuring him. Upon getting up he saw Rollins lying upon the ground unconscious. He was taken to Dr. L. D. Lindsey, who pronounced him dead. He was buried in the ground near the foot of the hill. The boy is passing along as well as can be expected.
