

DOVE OF PEACE VISITS SMELTER

End Reached at Last in Controversy at Bingham Junction Over Wages.

COMPANY ANNOUNCES RAISE.

Men Ratify at a Rally and Work Will Be Resumed in All Departments Tomorrow Morning.

The strike germ in Utah seems after all to be a good tempered bug despite its energy in jumping about from place to place. After the settlement of a peaceable strike at Bingham Junction seems now to be on the way to final adjustment with every prospect that the United States smelter will be in full operation tomorrow morning at 7 o'clock.

The one act of violence that marred the peaceful conduct of the latest strike was a shot fired in the darkness by some unidentified person, resulting in the death of Anastasio Kovallis. Greeks are now co-operating with the sheriff's office in an effort to locate the murderer in this case, and that will be the only indication of the "late unpleasantness" remaining after smoke again issues from the big stacks.

Peace was arranged for the Bingham Junction strike after the company had issued a statement, declaring for a new wage scale, and announcing its intention to resume work Saturday morning. The time since the recent strike has been spent in repairing the copper furnaces so that the men will work under better conditions, and this is expected to remove one lively source of complaint.

COMPANY'S STATEMENT.

The statement of the smelting company was presented to the men at a mass meeting last night, and received satisfaction. It follows: The officials of the United States smelter met with a committee of its employees this afternoon and notice was given to the employees that operations would be resumed on Saturday morning in accordance with the following notice and wage scale:

"All departments of the United States smelters will be started at 7 a. m. Saturday, May 25, 1907.

"Employees desiring to work at the following scale will report to their foremen on the proper shifts:
