

## CHINESE TO RECEIVE DECENT TREATMENT

President is Determined that the Same Courtesy Shall be Shown Them Accorded Others.

### LAW WILL STILL BE OBSERVED.

U. S. Diplomatic and Consular Representatives Must See that Exempt Classes Have Proper Certificates.

Washington, June 25.—By direction of President Roosevelt action has been taken by the administration which not only will facilitate the landing in this country of Chinese of the exempt classes, but will also eliminate from the immigration bureau such administrative features as have been the subject of criticism by Chinese. It is declared to be the intention of the president to see that Chinese merchants, travelers, students and others of the exempt classes shall have the same courtesy shown them by officers of the immigration bureau as is accorded citizens of the most favored nations.

Representations have been made to the president that in view of alleged harsh treatment accorded to many Chinese seeking a landing in the United States, the commercial guilds of China have determined to institute a boycott against the United States. The foreign representatives backed by the authority of the American Asiatic society and commercial bodies throughout the country, induced the president to make an investigation of the situation with a view to remedying the evils complained of if they are found to exist. The subject was discussed thoroughly with Secy. Metcalf of the department of commerce and labor, who has supervision of the immigration bureau.

#### PRESIDENT'S ORDERS.

As the result of the inquiry orders have been issued to the diplomatic and consular representatives of the United States in China by the president that they shall take such steps directly or through the performance of their duties under the exclusion law and see to it that members of the exempt classes coming to this country are provided with proper certificates. These certificates will be accepted at any port in the United States and will guarantee the holder against any harsh or discriminatory treatment. Such treatment intended will be the cause of the instant dismissal of the offending official, who ever he may be.

In addition to the president's orders Secy. Metcalf has issued instructions to the immigration officers which it is believed will remedy the difficulty heretofore existing by the Chinese, and individual Chinese are anticipated that the prompt action taken by the government to meet the objections by the Chinese will eliminate the possibility of serious trade difficulties between China and the manufacturers of this country.

#### OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

The text of the official correspondence and orders on the subject was made public today by authority of President Roosevelt. The president's orders to the diplomatic and consular officers of this country in China were transmitted through the state department and are as follows:

"The White House, Washington, D. C., June 24, 1905.—To the Secretary of State: The state department will immediately issue a circular to all our diplomatic and consular representatives in China setting forth the following facts and stating that it is issued by direct order of the president:

"Under the laws of the United States and in accordance with the spirit of the treaties now existing between the United States and China, all Chinese of the coolie or laboring class—that is, all Chinese laborers, skilled or unskilled—are absolutely prohibited from coming to the United States, but the purpose of the government of the United States is to show the widest and heartiest courtesy toward all merchants, traders, students and travelers who may come to the United States, as well as toward all Chinese officials or representatives in any capacity of the Chinese government. All individuals of these classes are allowed to come and go of their own free will and accord, and are to be given all the rights, privileges, immunities and exemptions accorded citizens and subjects of the most favored nations. The president has issued special instructions through the secretary of commerce and labor that while labor must be strictly excluded the law must be enforced without harshness and that all unex-

sary inconvenience and annoyance to ward Chinese persons entitled to enter the United States under the section 6, as it is avoided. These officials of the immigration department have been told that no harshness in the administration of the law will for a moment be tolerated, and that any discourtesy shown to Chinese persons by any official of the government will be cause for immediate dismissal from the service, and that the Chinese classes should truly be treated like other classes, and not as though they were.
