Cork, 9.—The corporation of Cork voted £100 toward a fund for the capture of the assassins.

LONDON, 10.—The bark *Pervenche*, from Mobile for St Louis, Senegal, was wrecked off that port and the cargo lost.

ROME, 10.—The deputies have approved the treaty of commerce with France.

MARSEILLES, 10.—Moors stoned the English minister at the court of Morocco; the Sultan imprisoned 600 men for connection with the assault.

DUBLIN, 11.—There have been further arrests in Drougheda, Longford and County Meath in connection with the assassination.

A man named Quail was arrested with stains on his trousers. He came from Dublin on Saturday.

The man Quail, or Quinn, arrested at Preston, yesterday, on suspicion of being concerned in the murder of Cavendish and Burke, was remanded until Saturday.

It is stated that as Right Hon. M. Merris, Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas and the Right Hon. Charles Robert Barry, Fourth Justice of the Court of Queen's Bench, were walking in Phoenix Park on Saturday a few minutes after the murders were committed, and before they knew of them, a rough looking man said to the Lord Chief Justice:

"The chief and under secretary have been murdered; you are the next man spotted."

LONDON, 11.—A large crowd gathered at St. Pancras railway station to day to witness the departure of a special train conveying mourners to Chatsworth to attend the funeral of Lord Frederick Cavendish.

CARLO, 10.—The Egyptian state revolutionary ministry, in violation of the organic law, have summoned the Chamber of Notables over the head of the Khedive.
