GENERAL NEWS.

Closing New York Exchanges.

New York, 15.—The Clearing House exchanges for the week show increased business over the corresponding week of last year at all points except Baltimore and Syracuse. The following are the details according to published returns, gains: New York, 23.04; Boston, 20.77; Philadelphia, 0.00; Chicago, 31.02; St. Louis, 47.00; Cincinnati, 41.01; San Francisco, 18.00; Milwaukee, 5.10; New Orleans, 88.08; Pittsburgh, 44.02; Louisville, 5.01; Providence, 22.08; Kansas City, 31.07; Indianapolis, 48.02; Cleveland, 37.07; New Haven, 38.07; Lowell, 19.06; Los Angeles, 19.08; Syracuse, 15.05.

This record of the exchanges is much better than of the preceding week and shows that no decline in the activity of the business has yet occurred. Comparing the corresponding week last year, which after the speculative excitement had begun, and while the surprising activity in legitimate trade was supplemented by enormous purchases on speculation, we find that the exchange of last week show an increase of 22.7 per cent, in the aggregate, or 20.7 per cent. On the New York there is no sign either of unreasonable and dangerous speculative excitement or of stagnation.

A Spanish Diplomat Wants a Review of our Tariff Laws.

The memorandum presented by Senor Ochoa, minister of foreign affairs to the American government, examines the state of the commercial relations between Cuba and the United States, with a view to showing what concessions Spain requires from American tariff legislation for Cuban and Porto Rican sugars and molasses. Senor Ochoa, like his predecessors, desires to prepare the way for a general treaty of commerce and navigation between the United States and Spain and the colonies, on the basis of reciprocity and the most favored nation's treatment, but the Spanish government knows the difficulties presented by such a policy in the present state of opinion in Congress and in American commercial circles would readily accept a convention fixing certain privileges for Cuban sugars and molasses in the American market if the Washington government were prepared to accept and demand this policy before Congress as an equivalent for the concessions of the Spanish statesmen are ready to make in Cuban and Porto Rican tariffs on flour and imports from the United States.

Jewell's Opinion of the Maine Election.

A Tribune reporter interviewed Marshal Jewell who said: "While the result of the election may be regarded as a republican reverse, it is not a democratic victory. We have been aware for a number of weeks that the State was over run with money to be used against us. In my opinion the election has been influenced by the money power. Then you do not consider the result unexpected or discouraging? Not at all. It is the greatest danger that the electoral vote of Maine will be lost to Garfield."

FOREIGN.

GREAT BRITAIN.

London, 15.—Havens dispatches say: Rev. Mr. Marling, the newly elected President, took charge of the government of Santo Domingo September 1st. In his inaugural address, referring to foreign relations, the President declared that he will endeavor to enter into as intimate a union as possible with the Spanish American Republics, and will exert all his power to attain to such a union. Regarding the relations with the Vatican he says that as President he will especially seek to be head of the people which, professing most advanced doctrines, considers it at the same time its glory to be essentially Catholic, and have constantly lived in the union of the Church, has never varied in its sentiment of reverence and obedience to the Sovereign Pontiff. No alliance is made to the United States. President Marling has formed the following cabinet: Ulysses Huesca, Minister of War; Marcial Cordero, Minister of the Interior and Police; Elvira Groveland, Minister of Justice and Public Instruction; R. Roscoso, Minister of the Treasury and Finance. The President has appointed a commission to run the mills only four days a week.
