SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 22.—A resolution passed
granting the privilege of the floor of
the Senate to the Commissioner of
Agriculture and the president of the
Smithsonian Institution.

Mr. Miller, of California, remarked that

Mr. Miller, of California, presented a
petition of the citizens of California

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 22.—In accordance
with the resolution adopted yesterday,
the House met at 11 o'clock.

Dingley asked unanimous consent
