THE PEOPLE'S PARTY.

Call of the Central Committee for Salt Lake City.

A Municipal Convention of the People's Party was held at the City Hall, Salt Lake City, on Saturday, February 4th, 1888.

At 11 o'clock a. m. to nominal candidates to be voted for at the Municipal Convention to be held on Monday, February 6th, 1888. The Convention will consist of thirty-six delegates, allotted to the several Municipal Wards as follows:

First Municipal Ward, comprising the First, Second, Third, Eighth, Ninth and Tenth Bishops' Wards.

Second Municipal Ward, comprising the Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Bishops' Wards.

Third Municipal Ward, comprising the Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Thirteenth, Fourteenth and Fifteenth Bishops' Wards.

Fourth Municipal Ward, comprising the Sixteenth, Seventeenth, Eighteenth, Nineteenth, Twentieth and Twenty-first Bishops' Wards.

Fifth Municipal Ward, comprising the Twenty-second, Twenty-third, Twenty-fourth, Twenty-fifth, Twenty-sixth and Twenty-seventh Bishops' Wards.

Primary meetings of the registered voters of the People's Party, for the election of delegates to the Convention, will be held at the several Municipal Wards of this city, at the usual places of holding elections, thereat, on Monday, January 30th, 1888.

Delegates should receive credentials, properly authenticated by the Chairman and Secretary of the meetings electing them.

Leading citizens of the several Municipal Wards are respectfully requested to be the initiative in carrying out the suggestions of the committee to-morrow evening, 7:30 o'clock. A good program has been prepared. All the members of the Utah Presbyterian Church are invited. A number are expected to be present, and a good time looked for. As it is believed that the exercises will be interesting and profitable to all, the public is cordially invited."

The new Transcontinental Line, between Salt Lake and Los Angeles, is attracting considerable attention as a possible transcontinental line. The road will, it is said, cut down the distance from Chicago to Southern California over 600 miles via Denver, Salt Lake and the proposed road. It is claimed that it will be an independent line, and that no other existing company has anything to do with it; also that it will not be an extension of the Utah Central branch of the Union Pacific, which now terminates at Frisco in Utah, about 280 miles southwest of Ogden, although this has come into possession of the new company. The distance from Chicago to Salt Lake is about 1,000 miles, and says, as a line from California to San Francisco the new road will be 130 miles longer than the present short line of the Union and Southern Pacific, only 80 miles shorter than the Santa Fe route by way of Kansas City and Denver, and only 10 miles shorter than by way of Burlington, Denver & Rio Grande and Central Pacific. As the shortest line makes the route will not have any appreciable value in respect to Southern California business, and will not have as good a road for Central California as that already existing. However, the Missouri Pacific is interested in the enterprise, as has generally been believed, that gives the motive for constructing a road apparently not otherwise needed.

An Inhuman Parent.

Near the old toll gate at the mouth of Logan Canyon lives a family by the name of Hodgees. They have a daughter who has been subject to fits for a number of years, and is somewhat demented. It is evident that she has not had the care that unfortunately of this class should have. During the recent cold weather which has been experienced here she was out during one of the coldest days, and was found lying on the ground, and when she came on, instead of her father allowing her to sleep in a room where there was a fire, she was sent up into the loft. Here she passed the night with her head and feet exposed on her feet, and without sufficient clothing to keep her warm. The next morning her hands and feet were frozen, but she kept around until Sunday last, when it became necessary to put her to bed and call someone in to wait on her. Dr. O. C. Ormsby was sent for, and upon examination found that it would be necessary to amputate one foot and part of the other, and two or three fingers of each hand. There should become punishment for a parent who would so neglect one of his children as to allow her to freeze in the manner above described.

COUNCIL.

January 26, 1888.
