ST. LOUIS.—In the Circuit Court,

yesterday, George A. King, defendant,

Wm. O'Brien, engineer, and J. W.

Hastings, fitter, of the construction

for damages of nearly thirty thousand

dollars, for injuries received in

consequence of a collision of their

train with a passenger train, resulting

from alleged negligence of the com-

pany, in not showing signal lights and

flags at the station where the accident

recently brought a suit against

one of its conductors for the wanton

destruction of railroad property by

collision, caused by the conduct of

order. This case can be sustained

under the law of this State, provided

the facts, as stated, are proven.

WASHINGTON.—The House bill pass-

ed, authorizing the Comptroller of Cur-

rency to examine the condition of cur-

rency not having been excited to

treasury by Duray's taunts and his

knowledge of his stricken enemy's con-

dition. It is said the quarrel grew out

of Duray's refusal to pay a debt which he owed Simmons.

PROVIDENCE.—Rhode Island Medical

Society has admitted the first female

member, Miss Anna E. F. Bowles Bro-

ws, who was married at Ingleside,

six miles from this city, last evening,

at the suit of Jno. H. Miller, of the

city, for \$3,985, funds deposited with

the firm of Nathan & Appleton, Boston,

special partners of Gordon Bowles Bro-

ws. The trial will be heard before the Mis-

ter of Chancery.

Chas. S. P. Bowles was arraigned this

afternoon. He gave temporary bail to

appear within thirty days.

CONCORD.—The New Hampshire

State temperance convention had

today, re-nominated Rev. John Black-

man for Governor and Asa S. Kendall,

R. R. Commissioner; prohibiting abo-

lition was adopted. The conven-

tional adjourned.

NEW YORK.—A cable from Liverpool

says a steamer had arrived there which

spoke with the American vessel which

had been lost two weeks ago.

The steamer will probably de-

liver her arrival here three or four days.

All on board were well. In conse-

quence of this the White Star Line will not

dispatch a steamer on Saturday. The old

officer of the Pacific coast steamship

company says the Great

Republic will be detained in port on the

Pacific coast three weeks to repair a

broken shaft.
