Officers Claim That Cody Murderers Are Well Known Local Men.

Mecteetse, Wyo., Nov. 7.-Local officers who have been at work on the Cody bank robbery case, and chase after the out-

laws, have made some starting discov-eries during the past two days, and it is now claimed that a local man was beyond question one of the leaders in the descent on the bank and murder of Cashier Mid-daugh.

It has been learned that when the two outlaws reached a point is miles south of Cody in their mad dash for safety they were met by two members of the gang. One of the men who participated in the attack on the bank joining one of the men at the can-yon and starting off in one direction, while the other robber joined the second member and together they started out in a different direction. It has been learned that without a doubt one of the men-the tailest of the two-who killed Middaugh, is a resident of this county, and is well known; also that one of the two men in waiting at the guich is a resident of Big Horn county.
