

PRESS VIEW OF FINGER GRAFTING.

No admission fee was charged yesterday to witness one of the costliest demonstrations of finger grafting on record, Dr. A. L. Nelson, of No. 13 East Twenty-ninth street, advertised for a woman's second finger, for which a woman patient was willing to pay \$500. One hundred applicants responded,

from whom the physician selected one who was perfectly willing to surrender her finger. The two women had never been introduced until they met yesterday in the operating room. Others present were the surgeon, two physicians, four pretty nurses and six reporters and artists. One of the principals had lost two joints of her left second finger by a re-

volver shot. She had been using a false digit, so that the deformity was fairly well hidden, but she decided that she must have one grafted on. The woman who furnishes the finger comes from Brooklyn, where she says her husband is well able to get along with two fingers less than nature prescribes. She thought it would make him feel less embarrassed if she parted with one just as a polite man will not wear his kid gloves at an evening reception if his wife has either forgotten hers or comes from some place where such things are not in style. The woman who is to gain a finger is tall and blond; the other is head and shoulders shorter and a brunette. Their hands, however, are of the same size.

Dr. Nelson gave the subjects hypodermic injections of cocaine, which deadened the sensation in the arms. He laid bare the fingers to the bone and sewed together the flaps. The arms of the two were bandaged together. Dr. Nelson says no arteries have been cut, and nothing of the kind will be done until a mutual circulation has been established. Then he will sever the bone of the sound finger, disconnect the flaps, and the two women will say goodbye in about three weeks. The County Medical society is taking some interest in the case, but has not taken any action. Dr. Nelson, a year ago, said he performed a similar feat when he was buying ears at \$500 each, but there has always been more

or less of a mystery connected with the affair.—New York Herald.

Everything thus fitting before the mind's eye must be a creation, not a recollection, to him who can only have gathered vague notions of form

from the touch and who can have no idea of color. "Anyway, it's worth looking into, it seems to me."

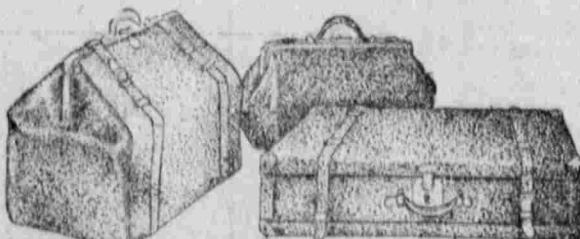

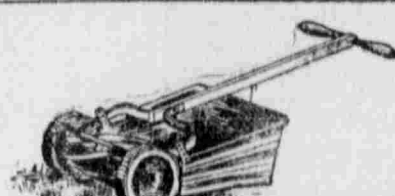
