AIR-BRAKE OF MR. LAPISH.

He Says Dunbar Said McCune Would be Glad to Aid Him With It.

DUNBAR DENIES THE STATEMENT

And Says the Air-Brake Was Only Mentioned Incidentally—Hugh Cannon and B. T. Lloyd Testify—The Cook-Farr Case to Be Taken Up.

The principal features of today's proceedings were the statements of Representatives Lapish and Mr. Dunbar and the testimony of Mr. Hugh Cannon, business manager of the Utah Historical company, to the effect that he did not know that Mr. Whitney was authorized to make arrangements for bidders outside of the contract with the Historical Co.; the cross-examination by Mr. Whitney showed that Frank J. Cannon had told Mr. Whitney, out-side of the contract, but through the agency of Cannon & Sons, and that Mr. Whitney had made similar contracts with Joseph R. Brown and Mr. McCune, and that he had not told Mr. Lapish that he did not believe it was right to exclude Hughes from the bidding.

Mr. Dunbar testified to the contrary.

The eighth day of the bribery investigation proceedings commenced at 8:30 this morning, with all members of the committee present. On motion of Attorney Evans the name of Judge C. A. Key was entered as additional counsel for the defense.

Shortly before the proceedings began Judge Powers entered the chamber. Mr. Powers had been engaged by Arthur Brown who also engaged the "key" what was his name before the committee?

"Yes, I have," was the reply. As one of the chairman, Mr. Evans, announced that the investigation was ready and the investigation may proceed, Representative Blowers moved that the president judge Powers, who he said, desired to make a statement.

EMBALMED ORGAN.

Mr. Powers said he had confidence in each member of the committee, even Mr. Stewart and Mr. Evans, who were Rep.
