NEGLECTED BOY DIES OF FEVER

Proprietress of Rainere Makes
Charges Against Health
Authorities.

WAS SHUT UP ALONE IN ROOM

Need for Hospital for Contagious Dis-
eases is Again Evident in
This Latest Case.

Mrs. E. J. Wilcox of the Rainere hotel sends a communication to the Deseret News, which once more calls attention to the urgent need of a ward for contagious diseases to take care of transient cases and those without friends who have rooms in hotels and apartment houses.

Mrs. Wilcox charges that the death of the young man James Cramer who succumbed to scarlet fever, was due to the alleged neglect on the part of the health authorities. She says:

"I would like to express myself through the columns of the News regarding the death of the boy James Cramer who died at the Rainere hotel a few days ago, from an attack of scarlet fever aggravated by negligence on the part of the county officials. During his sickness, the worst period of which was during the hot weather of last week, the boy was shut in a poorly ventilated room, lighted from above by a skylight. No one visited him, and no attention was given him save by the attending doctor who visited him twice a day. Dr. Odell told me he would do his duty by him, which consisted in seeing that he had food and medical treatment, but he had no authority to move him. He advised me to go to the board of health, which I did, demanding that it get the boy a place where he could have air. The board did not have a place for him, and he was too sick to read the directions, if he had them.

Heretofore the girls have refused to enter the organization, but after an address of H. W. Bennett last night in which he invited the girls to join, all of those present did so.

Custom House to Move.—The Salt Lake Custom House will remove from the Atlas block to the Boston block on the last week in this month, Miss Marie Luce, who has long officiated as deputy collector, will resign on the 25th inst., to marry and remove to Chicago, her place being taken by Miss Alice Edwards. Miss Luce has a letter of recommendation from the department at Washington, of which she has every reason to feel proud.

Sanitary Features Omitted.—The state commission, which passed upon the school buildings before erection, decided yesterday afternoon to stop four school buildings because they did not provide for proper sanitary conditions. The board approved the plans of a 12-room school at Spanish Fork to be constructed of brick which will cost about \$25,000. The plans for new school buildings in Boxelder county were also approved. The commission met in the office of A. C. Nelson, state superintendent of public schools.
