NEW NEVADA CAMP.

Lawson and others. They have located quite a large number of excellent copper, gold, sil-ver and lead claims; have taken ur 16 placer claims for a townsite, which is one of the finest locations in that whole minerial belt. The town is located about half a mile west of one of the largest copper lodes in this state. It is about four miles in this state.
