Shot in the Face While Out to Hunt for Quail.

## NARROW ESCAPE FROM DEATH.

Needs Making Heavy Shipments in Cattle—Reports Over Many Matters Results in a Stabbing Affray.

Seven horses were stopped last week from San Francisco to Sacramento, Calif., where the animals will be fed on chicken feed. It is said that a large number of native stockmen horses meet the same fate every year.

The young lad, fortunately, escaped death.

For however good your work may be, new writers will always find you unable to appear more often than once or twice in the index of a single volume.

We read all year of the "favorite contributor." D. You happen to know who he is? He is the one who sends us his manuscript, and who is continually asking for more.
