## LOCAL BRIEFS.

**Sunday School Picnic**—The Westminster Presbyterian Sunday school will picnic Monday next at Wandermere.

**Will Talk in a Tent**—Rev. S. G. Huntington, Seventh Day Adventist, will speak during the month in a tent on Market street.

**Burt Elected Delegate**—The Street Carriers' union elected last night Secy. A. H. Burt as delegate to the international convention which meets in New Orleans in October.

**Capt. Brooks Transferred**—Captain L. C. Worthington of the Twenty-ninth Infantry has been appointed regimental quartermaster, vice Capt. Brooks, transferred to Fort Bliss, Tex., as construction quartermaster.

**Governor Cutler at Venice**—Utah day at Venice, Cal., will be July 10, when Gov. Cutler will be present to speak. Other guests of honor will be U. S. Senator Perkins of California, and Secy. of the Navy Metcalf.

**Murdered Miner Buried**—Henry Eckman, who was murdered at Bingham Thursday last, was buried yesterday afternoon in the city cemetery from Hall's undertaking rooms. The Phoenix Mining company offers \$100 reward for the assassin's arrest.

**Meeting Postponed**—Chairman Leonard and S. M. Barlow were the only members who showed up at the time announced for the meeting of the board of public works last night hence the meeting had to be postponed. The meeting will probably be held within a few days.

**Where is N. A. Johnson?**—A letter has been received by County Clerk Eldredge from Nettie C. Johnson at Broadway, Loganport Ind., inquiring as to the whereabouts of her foster-father, Carl W. A. Johnson, who was in Salt Lake the last time she heard from him in 1892.

**Easterners are Due**—The easterners connected with the company which has taken over the Sanpete Valley railway option, are on their way here and it is expected they will put in an appearance tomorrow. The company is to be known as the Utah Southern. It has elected officers and will select directors Monday.

**Swallowed Cartridge Shell**—Clarence Murphy of Idaho, aged 13, was found by the police yesterday afternoon on the streets in a precarious condition, having swallowed the empty shell of a 22 caliber cartridge. He was removed to the police station, where Dr. Paul attended him. Murphy's mother is a patient at the L. D. S. hospital.

**Injured by Bursting Bottle**—A Peterson of Logan employed at Lagoona, was injured Thursday afternoon, while running the corking machine in bottling root beer. He put on too much pressure, which burst the bottle in his hand, and Peterson was badly gashed over the eye by a fragment of glass. He was sent to this city where the wound was stitched.

**Got Most of it Back**—W. M. Haverford has pocketed the other day while he was in a train for the lake, the wallet, stolen containing \$6,000 in checks, \$4,000 in stock certificates, and \$240 in currency. The thief kept the cash, but dropped the wallet and papers in a mail box, where they were found last evening and turned over to the postmaster. So, Mr. Haverford has recovered that much of his property. The carrier turning in the papers will be suitably rewarded.

**Celebrated Energetically**—Joseph Smith and John Dolan, two miners from Alta, were celebrating the Fourth with too much energy to suit the people of that camp hence they were placed under arrest by Deputy Sheriff Patten and were brought down to the county jail yesterday afternoon. The men are charged with setting off some dynamite to blow a window in the Alta Mercantile company's store and wrecking the front part of the building.

**Will Guard Crossings**—The Oregon Short Line has promised to station flagmen at all crossings along Third West between Third and Seventh South streets. These flagmen will be stationed at the Mead street crossing. Numerous complaints and petitions have been received by the city council relative to the speed of trains and danger at crossings on Third West and the steps taken followed a conference between the council and P. Williams of the Oregon Short Line's legal department.

**Explosion Was Costly**—The powder which exploded near Hot Springs Tuesday was valued at \$7,400. Just whose loss this will be is for the railroad company and the Stover-Pearson Hardware company to decide between them. It is argued the consignment was practically delivered, although a big portion of the stuff was still in the cars. But the other hand it may be shown that the railroad company backed the train on to the switch when the sagebrush along the foothills was ablaze.
