

LONDON, 19.—G. O. Trevelyn, the new Irish Secretary took his seat last night and was received warmly by the liberal benches. The Home Rulers preserved a marked silence. Later on he arose to defend the new coercion act, which, in his preamble, he declared would not be used against any constitutional effort to alter the existing institution. This announcement was received with ironical cheers by some of the Irish members. In defending and explaining the details of the measures, he adopted Mr. Forster's method of producing a decidedly unfavorable impression on those Irish members, who had looked for a more sympathetic attitude.

WASATCH STAKE CONFERENCE.

The 19th quarterly conference of the Wasatch Stake of Zion, convened at Heber City at 10 a.m. May 6th, 1882.

Present, of the Apostles, F. M. Lyman and J. H. Smith; also Jeremiah Hatch, Bishop of Ashley, President Abm. Hatch and his Counselors, Patriarch Thos. Hicken, the High Council, Bishops of the several Wards and their Counselors, Presidents of Quorums, and a well filled house from all parts of the Stake.

Singing and prayer. President Hatch expressed his pleasure at again meeting with so many on this the first day of our quarterly conference, and thanked all for the kindly feelings manifested toward him while absent and also on his return home.

J. Hatch, Bishop of Ashley, related some of his experience while in that new locality. Spoke highly of the advantages of the country, and gave great credit to a large number of the inhabitants for their stability and efforts to obey counsel. The forenoon was principally occupied by the Bishops in reporting their wards. After which Apostle J. H. Smith addressed the conference, occupying the time until the close of the forenoon services, giving us an interesting account of his late visit to Washington.

Adjourned till 2 p. m.

2 p. m. The Bishops who had not previously spoken, reported their wards. After which Apostle F. M. Lyman addressed the conference upon the frailties of man, perfection, our object in coming here and the necessity of our having the Spirit of God to guide us; our duties toward our families and the consequences of neglect on our part in rearing our children.

At 10 a. m., Sunday, the house was filled to its utmost capacity. Singing and prayer. Presidents reported the situation of their quorums, after which Apostle J. H. Smith spoke in regard to the efforts to crush out "Mormonism," the persecutions that have been forced upon us from the first, and the effects produced. Our trials, and the opposition we receive are only for our good, they tend to brighten us up and make us more zealous in good works. President Hatch made a few remarks in the way of approval of what he had heard.

At 2 p. m., met as per adjournment, and opened in the usual manner. Sacrament partaken of. President Hatch said in partaking of the Lord's Supper we should do so with the greatest solemnity, duly remembering the great sacrifice made by our Lord, and in partaking thereof renew our covenants with Him. We should also remember the rights of each other, and keep in view, and observe the saying: "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you." The Local Authorities of the Stake were put before the Conference and unanimously sustained.

Apostle F. M. Lyman considered we were as temperate a people in this Stake as could be found; as free from the use of tobacco and as strict in keeping the Word of Wisdom, gave an excellent discourse on morals, and how to conduct ourselves toward each other. The teachings during the Conference were enjoyed by all, and the people returned to their homes blessed and comforted.

Adjourned for three months. Benediction by Apostle John Henry Smith.
