The chair then laid before the Senate a bill fixing the salary of United States Judges, but without action on that the Senate went into executive session and when the doors were opened adjourned.

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 17.—Dibble, of South Carolina asked leave to introduce a resolution proposing a constitutional

second Vice-President, who shall be voted for in distinct ballots at the same time and in like manner, and for the same term as the President and Vice-President by the electors appointed by the several States. The second vice-president shall preside in the absence of the Vice-President or in case the office of Vice-President shall devolve upon the Vice-President.

Randall, of Pennsylvania, said he had a like measure which he would like to have go with the proposition of the gentleman from South Carolina.

Here followed a long discussion on appropriation committees.

Spring of Illinois, offered an amendment for the division of the committee on railways and canals, into two committees, and this proposition was favored by Henderson, of

Murphy, of Iowa, and other advocates of the Hennepin canal project, contended that the interest of the railways and canals were so antagonistic one to the other, that they should not be combined under the jurisdiction of one committee.

The House, however, refused to order a division by a vote of 24 to 133.

A proposition to create a constitutional amendment committee, presented by Bayne of Pennsylvania, having been defeated through the vigorous

Opposition of Tucker of Virginia, an amendment was offered by Payne of New York, to give the committee on the revision of laws jurisdiction over the proposed amendments to the constitution. The amendment failed.

The membership of the committee on accounts was increased to nine.

Springer of Illinois made several attempts to abolish committees which he deemed useless, declaring that some could be done as well by expert clerks, but his efforts were unsuccessful.

Pending an effort on his part to abolish the committees on public expenditures in various departments, and to create a single committee on the subject, in the executive department, he
