PORPHYRY COPPERS STRONG FAVORITES

Steam Shovels Were Used Nearly a Decade Ago and Many Mines Have Produced 7-Cent Copper.

"Low cost coppers," and "porphyry coppers" are fair phrases to conjure with. But they will bear closer distinctions. There is nothing essentially in common between the low cost of producing copper and the occurrence of the metal in a "porphyry" formation. Moreover, that which is recognized as new or revolutionary in the type of copper mine usually meant by the "porphyry" variety is not essentially the low cost of production, for copper has been produced for seven centuries ago upon the low-grade deposits of the Granby Consolidated in British Columbia. A combination of conditions and external circumstances may be said to enter into the definitions.

Primarily, the terms have gained their present-day through their use in the financial world, where the distinction of capital in copper enterprises for the development of supplies to meet the rapidly growing demand for the metal in manufacturing has centered attention upon competitive costs, it being apparent that cheap production in times of depression such as the country has just experienced, has the first advantage and the greater staying qualities. During a quarter of a century the price of copper has averaged 13 cents, and it has three times stood below that figure since 1900. There has been a want of encouragement to mine copper, but the emphasis has fallen upon the cheapness of mining. Interesting to note, however, where this has been attained, is accompanied by magnitude of production not only of copper but especially of the ore from which it is produced since the latter is the principal factor in this type of mining. The word "porphyry" enters into consideration because the formation which it signifies is commonly crushed and readily concentrated before smelting. Immense piles are able to present a smelting product at a cost less than that of the commonly brought forth, partly because of the magnitude of milling operations and partly because of the greater cheapness of obtaining an equivalent in these cases to quarrying.

It is, perhaps, no wonder that the "porphyry copper" stocks have become a great favorite on the curb and the mining exchanges. They hold out something new to the investor, and the experienced copper interests are losing no opportunity to seize upon the promising prospects of this character. It takes a great deal of money to establish one of these projects, but men of money are in the business and a broad market for the shares is being made.

STOCKS STILL VERY SLOW.

Prices Show Decline With No Signs of Quick Improvement.

Prices took to the low levels today on the Salt Lake Stock and Mining exchange. The decline in some of the larger stocks was sharp, but it is commonly regarded as a temporary reaction. Many were looking for vacation money and wished to let go of their holdings. Most of the old stars were dim shadows of themselves when the season was over today. NEW EXCHANGE IS NOW RE-ORGANIZING

C. W. Hartley Resigns From Various Committees and F. O. McFall Takes His Place—Change in Board.

For some time there has been considerable dissatisfaction among the members of the Utah Stock and Mining exchange and a re-organization plan is now being put through. Certain members of the board have been asserting that one of the members has been endeavoring to wreck the exchange and hand it over to others. Trouble has been brewing for some time and Saturday it started with a meeting of the members. This has been carried over from day to day until a meeting was held this morning at which a number of changes were made.

At the meeting C. W. Hartley, promoter of the organization, resigned from the various committees. It was further asserted that Hartley did not even hold a seat on the board. When matters became warm Hartley is said to have admitted that the seat was not in his name but that it was owned by him under some other person's name. He is still retained as treasurer of the organization.

The various committees appointed this morning were: Arbitration, D. Hughes, F. O. McFall and Ray Brim; Membership, F. O. McFall, F. O. McFall and J. A. Edwards; Rules and regulations, M. E. Eakin, T. W. Ireland and G. B. Martin; Arrangements, F. O. McFall, H. M. Eakin and J. A. Edwards; Listing, Calderwood, H. W. Eakin and T. W. Ireland.

Calderwood handed in his resignation as a member of the governing board and F. O. McFall was appointed in his stead. The resignation of Henry J. Mueller was also received but was not acted upon at the meeting.

"We are going to make the exchange go for a little longer at least," said one of the members this morning. "On account of the trouble caused by one of the members the brokers had not been out after business as strong as they might have been."

OLD WAREHOUSE IS GOING UP

Structure Used by Highland Boy Smelter Now Being Erected.

The steel for the old Highland Boy warehouse and shops is now on the ground at Tooele and within the next two weeks will be finished. The information given out this morning by the International Smelting and Refining Company for some time Contractor Burke and his man have been removing the machinery and buildings of the old Highland Boy plant at Bingham Junction. The material is now at the new smelter site and is fast being put into place.

OHIO COPPER FINANCED.

This will be the first building of any consequence erected at the plant. Steel is now going into the smelter site at the rate of three cars a day.

Expected That Plans Will Be Announced in Few Days.

New York, June 30.—It was stated today that negotiations which have been under way for some time for the financing of the Ohio Copper Company are practically concluded, and that the details will be announced within a few days. The Ohio, which is one of the Heinze properties, has been in difficulties ever since the fall of 1907, and its development has been greatly retarded. Work has, however, been continued on the new mill, the construction of which had been started before the panic, and this is now so well along that with the additional cars which now seems assured, two units with a capacity of 1,200 tons a day, will be in operation by July 15. It is expected that sufficient new capital will be provided so that the capitalization will be more than doubled within six or eight months.
