Over 17,000 shares of stock were sold on the stock exchange today for \$30,353. Prices on the whole were quite firm, though some general features are reported on the day's transactions.

Depression in Railway Stocks—Live Stock is Weak—Produce Shows Up Higher.

New York, Sept. 10.—The cotton market opened irregular and excited with prices up to 42 to 61 points on a wave of buying, the equal of which has not been witnessed in many years. Every broker had buying orders. Representatives of southern and foreign interests frantically endeavored to secure enormous blocks of cotton, which, for a brief period, seemed to have become priceless. The market was well termed "dangerous," after the call a tumble of 18 to 20 points occurred under a sudden turn about of holders for profits. Wall street and the exchange, however, overcame their fears and again stepped into the market in lots of several thousand bales in profits aggregating \$47,100 and 150 points, acquired since the bull movement set in ten days ago. But the market showed amazing recuperative energies and in face of weak late cables, rebounded 12 to 15 points with rush on a fresh whirl of general buying, which swept everything before it. Exchange in the process was unprecedent, and held without any bounds. Thereafter the fluctuations were violent both ways, though at no time did the bears claim the slightest influence. Conservative estimates placed the forenoon transactions at 450,000 bales.

The origin of the built drift and panic of the bears was the West Indian country. Parties therewith acquainted with the territory affected, and with a definite knowledge of the crop condition previous to the storm, declared the damage could not be less than 500,000 bales, with 1,000,000 bales very possible.
