LITTLE ROCK, Ark, 3.—A special 'rom the Indian Territory gives the particulars of one of the most thril-ting events in the criminal aunals of that country, the occasion being the recution by shoo ing of Haney ard Lilly, two Indian mu derers, at Oc mulgee. The crime with which they 'ere charged and declared guilty was the murder of an Indian named Ochunhaijo on the night of Febru-try 19th Cilly, hed was the murder of an Indian named Dehunhaijo on the night of Febru-vry 12th. Lilly had some weeks before robbed the murdered man's nouse. Being detected, he deter-mixed to destroy the only witness of his guilt.
