LAST CABINET MEETING.

The Session Devoted to the Discussion of Notices of Public Importance.

Washington, D. C., March 7.—The invention into office of the members of President Cleveland's cabinet, says Secretary Graham, was sworn in yesterday, was a historic event. As the state government is preparing for the first time in the history of the government, the heads of the departments associated in the diplomatic partnership and had the oath of office. The necessity for filling the cabinet without delay was taken as a sufficient task, but Mr. Cleveland thought it more judicious to wait the necessity of going slowly in making

his decision in the case of the G. F. Grant bill, and the cabinet members were given the action of the committee some time attention. He gave out a lengthy statement on the project. He believes that he is trying to do the most, and then say.

I presume the people of the state, like the country outside, will be very anxious to know what the result of the trial will be.
