

LAST RACE MEET OF THE SEASON.

Fine Program Marked the Final
Day of the State
Fair.

ANOTHER RECORD WAS BROKEN.

Free-For-All Won by Thompson's
Robert I—Enthusiastic Throng of
Fans Saw Interesting Events.

The races at the fair on Saturday afternoon were the last of the season, and they were also decidedly the best.

There was a large and witty enthusiastic crowd at the track, and the fans were given a royal treat, especially in the free-for-all when Crab Apple, the favorite, was beaten by Ezra Thompson's Robert I, the son of Hambletonian Wilkes.

This splendid animal won the chief event of the meet from a field of the fastest lot of horses in the state. He broke the state record in the first heat, and the first three heats were the fastest ever paced in Utah. The time was announced by the judges was 2:14, the quarters being 23 1/2, 1:06, 1:20 and 2:14. Several persons declared, however, that the heat was 2:13. That the great stallion could have gone faster was doubted by no one.
