

# TELEGRAPHIC. THE NOMINATIONS.

A Reputation of the Exciting Scenes of the Afternoon.

AT THE EVENING SESSION.

The Sudden Appearance of Bryan and the Gold Article Complicate Matters.

CHICAGO, July 9.—Upon Mr. Hill's demand the vote was taken by states on the adoption of the platform. As New York and Pennsylvania cast their blocks of votes against the platform, however, there was considerable dissenting.

A noticeable group of gold leaders attracted considerable attention down in the front of the seats occupied by the Massachusetts delegation while the vote on the platform was being taken. William C.
