UTAH WILL POST EXTRA DIVIDEND.

Directors to Meet Late This Afternoon in Regular Monthly Session.

TOTALS FOR YEAR \$6,000.

Property Has Been Prosperous—Our Resources Increased by Considerable—Galena Development.

The directors of the Utah mine at Fish Springs are scheduled to meet this afternoon at 4 o'clock at the offices of the company in the McCormick block. At this meeting, the regular dividend of one cent a share will be posted; and, in addition to this, an extra Christmas dividend of a like amount will be announced, both aggregating a total of \$2,000 and a grand total for the year of \$6,000.

The Utah mine has had a very prosperous year of it and has succeeded in increasing the ore reserves to a considerable extent. The development of the Galena mine, which was taken under a bond and lease a little over a year ago, has resulted in quite gratifying results, and the company's future prospects have been most encouraging.

Word was received by Socy. Weller during the forenoon that another car of high grade ore had left Oasis for the smelters.

FORENOON ON EXCHANGE.

Columbus Consolidated a Feature of The Open Board Trading.

Stocks were quite active on the floor of the mining exchange this forenoon and prices remained fairly steady, but the bulk of the business was done on the open board.

QUICKSILVER MINES CLOSED.

A California Property that Produced Fifteen Million Dollars.

San Jose, Cal., Dec. 14.—It is reported that the New Almeden quicksilver mines are to be closed down in the near future. For some years men have been laid off at the mines, until at present there are less than 35 men employed about the property. The mines are owned by the Quicksilver Mining company of New York. The reason assigned for closing the mines is that the property has been developed enough.

The new Almeden mines next to the Almeden mines, are at one time the largest in the world. The product up to March 6, 1891, amounted to \$15,000,000.

ELY A GREAT CAMP.

Salt Lake Parties Will Establish a Bank There.

Everyone who visits Ely, Nev., nowadays comes away with a good impression of that camp. The Deseret News frequently carries stories concerning its relation to possibilities of the Nevada district. Recently, the camp was visited by Theodore Wetmore of Reno and the Journal of that place credits him with saying that it will become the greatest copper camp of the world.

While the camp may yet be several million dollars, it has been expended in exploitation work, and the ore bodies are thoroughly blocked out, and at the depth attained is 750 feet, it is no longer a problematical matter.

There are no copper smelters ready to begin in immediately on the completion of the railroad, so that coke can be secured and it is proposed to at once construct a monster concentrator in connection with this plant, and two more smelters of 500 tons capacity are to be built without delay.

BOSTON CON. MORTGAGE.

One Filed Yesterday to Secure the Loan Recently Authorized.

In the office of the county recorder yesterday afternoon at the request of Charles C. Parsons, counsel for the Nowhouse mines, a first mortgage was filed on the properties of the Boston Consolidated Mining company in favor of the Federal Trust company to secure the recently authorized loan of \$1,000,000. The instrument bears the date Nov. 29, 1905, and provides that it will run until Oct. 1, 1910, to which time it is to discharge its obligation, the interest rate being 6 per cent, payable semi-monthly.

The Boston company now has the necessary funds to proceed with the construction of its big mill near Garfield.
