The State of New Mexico.

WASHINGTON, July 6.—Secretary Seward has received a brief telegram from General Commander Todd regarding the capture of the Mexican pirate, Juan Coyote Hidalgo, to arrest Indians charged with flying a bayonet.

A light vessel and seven men were also two Indians and two Americans who were shot out, but he managed to get Powers' horse, his own having been killed, and rode to the south west for safety, where he found a camp of Indians. Twelve men went back with him.

The two Indians who were killed were found buried in the sand. The body of Powers was found with his shirt torn off, and his heart cut out. The body was torn from McCay's fusilier's coat.

Powers was a single man. McCay leaves a wife and six children.

From the ring leader of the Indians it was learned that Powers and his two sons were captured in the number of Indians not long ago. He held a personal grudge against Powers. A posse of men was organized and armed, and it is feared more blood will be shed. There were six Indians in the party, but they are perhaps one-half as many Indians, and several hundred had been there.

Two Thousand Arrested.

PENNSYLVANIA, July 6.—The United States marshal, the federal treasurer of the cities, and all other officials of the United States, were arrested today on an order issued by a judge of the supreme court in Pittsburgh, and the amount of \$200,000 of the bank money and fastening the bonds.

NEW YORK, July 6.—Henry C. Allen, a member of the board of directors of the cigar firm for the leading manufacturers of the United States, was arrested today on an order issued by a judge of the supreme court in New York, which is the largest sum of his deficit as treasurer. The suit is brought in the instance of the board of directors. Allen's bail was fixed at \$10,000, in default of which he was committed to jail.

General Announcement of Hamlin's Death.

WASHINGTON, July 6.—President Harrison tonight authorized the following official announcement of the death of Vice-President Hamlin:

To the people of the United States:
"The President, with a profound sense of sorrow, announces the death of Hon. William W. Hamlin, Vice-President of the United States, who died at Bangor, Maine, yesterday, July 4. Few men in this country have more important and more distinguished services than those of Hon. Hamlin, and in recognition of his many eminent and varied services, and as an expression of the great respect and esteem felt for his memory, it is ordered that the flag of the nation be displayed at half-mast upon the public buildings of the United States on the day of his funeral."
