A Fire Destroys \$100,000 Worth of Damages at Gillette, Wyoming.

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A telegram announces that Lieutenant E. H. Plummer of the tenth Infantry, at Fort Meade, South Dakota, will be detailed by the war department to take charge of the Naval Indian agency at Fort Defiance, succeeded D. L. Shipley, formerly of Fort. There has been much complaint of the Indians that the removal and distribution of the cattle has caused this change is the result. For fifteen years the civil branch of the government has had the exclusive management of these Indians. Lieutenant Plummer is said to be one of the best and most efficient officers in the United States service. He has lately been superintendent of the Tenth Infantry, and twice served as disbursing quarter master of this district.

Fire almost wiped out the town of Gillette, on the Burlington in Crook county, Wyoming, the other night. All the buildings destroyed were Highty's Drug Store, Green's Hotel, and the Chinese laundry, a bakery, the Winter hotel and Hines Bros. grocery store. The loss is to the neighborhood of \$100,000, and no insurance. Gilbert, the Chinese laundry, is the only one left standing. The town has been the scene of a number of exciting happenings. In a year it has had no less than 120 killings, shooting scrapes and brawls without number, and an assassination two days ago. The most notorious of all the incidents is the shooting and robbing of a mail coach. According to the reports, the mail coach was stopped in the prairie, Gillette is now but a memory, says an eye-witness.
