Washington, D. C., Aug. 4.—Major Sylvester, chief of police of Washington, has started on a campaign which should bring down upon him the plaudits of all decent people. He has decided that the "red light district" must be removed, and that unnecessary noises must cease. The garbage man who blows a bass fish horn at five in the morning has been notified that he must make his rounds without disturbing the entire population. The "watermelon" pedlar must dispose of his wares without scratching out the information that "dey's red to de rine" and the major even insists that the streetcar companies shall be compelled to operate their equipment without rattling the telephones out of business along their entire routes.

But the most radical reform which the chief of police has undertaken is the moral cleansing of the blocks between Thirtieth and Fifteenth streets and Pennsylvania avenue and "The Mall." Ever since the civil war this particular section of the city has been occupied by the half world. But recently the magnificent new home of the District government which occupies a block on Pennsylvania avenue in this particular section, has been opened. Then, too, the new buildings of the department of agriculture immediately to the rear, across the Mall and a block away is the bureau of engraving and printing. In these two departments several thousand women and girls are employed and in the case of the bureau many of them go on and off duty late at night. It has been a crying disgrace to the national capital for many years that these women should be compelled to pass along the edges of the red light district on their way to and from their work and their homes.

The crusade has the cordial endorsement of every decent man in Washington from president down—except the owners of buildings who see their rents roll depleted—and Major Sylvester says every one will be closed in ten days. In view of the fact that he has established a quarantine line around the entire district across which no man is allowed to pass after nightfall, it is probable that he will keep his promise and that Washington's plague spot will be relegated to some more remote region than that in the immediate rear of the home of the city authorities, the most beautiful public building in the national capital.

### WHO WERE FIRST FAMILIES.

If so communicate with Hon. S. N. D. North, director of the United States census and enclose \$1. In return he will send you a list of the heads of families enumerated in that census in either Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, South Carolina or Virginia. Or if you think you had ancestors in all of those states at that time send him a postal order for \$1 and receive the entire set. Each state will be published separately as a part, or volume, consisting of from 200 to 300 pages, handsomely printed upon laid antique paper, sewed and bound with turned hump covers. Each part will be fully indexed, and will contain as frontispiece a map of the state represented, 18x7 inches in size, reproduced by lithography from an atlas published in 1796. In accordance with the law, these pamphlets are offered for sale by the director of the census at the uniform price of \$1 for each part. A limited number of sets will be bound up, so that all parts will appear in uniform cloth binding of a substantial character, making approximately four volumes. No extra charge will be made for the cloth binding in such case.

### MESCAL BUTTON.

Just as the wave of prohibition is at the flood tide, when half the southern states has gone dry and the center of the distilling industry in Kentucky was saved to the "wets" by a measly one majority, a startling story comes from Wisconsin. It is against federal law to sell liquor to Indians on any of the reservations but according to reports from the "Badger State" the Winnezago of that commonwealth are rapidly killing themselves with a new brand of booze. They have secured a supply of mescal buttons, whatever mescal buttons may be, and have started off on a protracted foot which threatens to land in the insane asylum every buck Winnezago who lives through his first debauch. Mescal and its cousin pulque is the favorite tipple of the lower classes in Mexico and it is claimed that the fermentation of the juice of the cactus plant is the prime cause of most of the outbreaks among the Yaqui and other Mexican Indians. But the Wisconsin case is the first reported wherein the Indians of the northern states have succumbed to the Mexican means of intoxication and the authorities are at a loss to find out how the poisonous stuff was introduced among the Winnezagos and by what means it was transported. Dr. Wiley, chief chemist of the department of agriculture, knows all about mescal, but the mescal button is a new one on him and he is proceeding to investigate. In the meantime Indian Commissioner Leupp will take steps to curtail the use of the button and will institute criminal proceedings against the persons responsible for the introduction of the stuff on the reservation.
