

## BRYAN KEEPS AT ROCKEFELLER

Asserts He Is Supporting Taft  
Because He Expects to Gain  
Much Through His Victory.

### HE HAS TORN THE MASK OFF

Made Plain Why Mr. Taft Is Not Will-  
ing to Publish List of Cam-  
paign Contributors.

Bowling Green, O., Oct. 30.—Keeping up his attacks on John D. Rockefeller and Andrew Carnegie, both of whom have announced publicly their support of Mr. Taft, William J. Bryan here today spoke to a big crowd.

"Do you understand now," he said, "why Mr. Taft is not willing that their contributions shall be published before election?"

Continuing, the Democratic candidate said:

"For a generation the Standard Oil company has been engaged in the pinching business. It has been pinching out of its rivals, and today has a tariff of about 120 per cent against its chief rival, Russia. Mr. Rockefeller is supporting the Republican ticket because he expects, through a Republican victory to put his hands in the pockets of 80,000,000 of people and not be molested in the extortion in which he is so keenly part.

Mr. Rockefeller, by his action, has torn the mask off the Republican party. The Republican party has been playing a double game in this connection. In the west it has been presenting Mr. Taft as a reformer and the east as a standpat. In the west it has been presenting Mr. Taft as a man who wants to improve conditions and down east they say:

"Just wait until he gets in and see how safe he will be."

"Now, I insist that the Republican party shall either serve God or Mammon. It cannot serve the plutocracy of this country and the masses at the same time. It cannot befriend the monopolies and at the same time protect the great American people; and Mr. Rockefeller has done the American people a signal service in coming out and taking his position where he belongs, on the side of the Republican party, because the Republican party is on his side.

"My friends, can any American farmer be deceived now as to the attitude of the Republican party? Can any Republican be so blind as not to understand what a Republican victory means? Do you understand now why Mr. Taft is not willing that their contributions shall be published before election? Do you understand now why it is that the congressional committee of the Republican party won't agree to publish its contributions even after the election? We have published ours. We have told you where our money was coming from. We have taken you into our confidence, because our money is coming from the people who are helping to fight this battle because it is their battle. More than 50,000 Democrats have already contributed to our campaign fund, and I would rather be helped by 50,000 Democrats each giving a little than by a few great trust magnates, and then have come to the back door of the White House and tell me what I must do in order to pay them back."

### A HOT DIALOGUE.

Mr. Bryan was comparing the platform of the Republicans and Democratic parties on the tariff question and laid great stress on the fact that the Democrats were demanding reduction, while the Republicans promised revision. This led to a hot dialogue between a man in the crowd, perched on the seat of a wagon, and the Democratic candidate.

"How will reduction of tariff help the unemployed?" he asked.

"Are you a Republican?" Mr. Bryan inquired, "and what is your name?" "Never mind that," answered the man, "answer the question."

"That," said Mr. Bryan, "gives you a fair example of his idea of justice. He knows who I am, but I have no right to know who he is."

"I made 127 speeches for you all over the United States. Will you answer my questions?"

"Well, sir, you ought to be making speeches this year. Tell me who you are."

The crowd by this time began to hiss.

the man and cried: "Go ahead, Mr. Bryan."

"Well, my friends," said the Democratic candidate, "if he is ashamed to tell you his name he ought not to be out making speeches. When a man goes to another man's meeting and asks a question, he ought to be man enough to tell who he is."

"What's that got to do with it? You cannot answer. Why don't you platform answer the unemployed proposition?"

"My friends, give me your attention," said Mr. Bryan. "He wants to know about the unemployed problem. I believe that the unemployed problem is due to the fact that there is an unfair distribution of the wealth created, and when we try to remedy the evil, that man helps to elect a Republican to keep the unemployed problem before the country." The crowd wildly cheered a burly man who tried to haul the disturber out of the crowd.

Continuing, Mr. Bryan said: "My platform mentions remedies, and it mentions all the remedies that are within reach. We say elect senators by the people and let the senators be responsible to the will of the people. We say destroy the trusts and open the door of opportunity and give the young man a chance in this country. We say take the extortion out of the price that the trusts have put into it. We say lessen the expense of government and leave money in the pockets of the people. We say lower the tariff and take the burden off the consumer. We say protect the savings of the people in the banks. These are some of the methods we have of giving employment to the unemployed."

### BRYAN ARRANGS ROUT.

Cleveland, O., Oct. 30.—Heaping denunciations upon the heads of John D. Rockefeller, Andrew Carnegie, President Roosevelt and Judge Taft because of their connection or sympathies with the trusts, William J. Bryan in this city tonight brought to a close another strenuous day of campaigning. The annual meeting of the Ohio State Central Association, and a second address was addressed at Gray's Armory. Later the candidate addressed street crowds from the balcony of the Hotel New York.

The arrival of the candidate at the principal armory was heralded by a

great throng outside, and those on the inside broke into a frenzy of applause when he made his appearance on the platform. Mr. Bryan apparently was at his best, his face glowing with every corner of the building. Launching at once into the issues of the campaign, the candidate discussed the Democratic platform, laying great stress on the plank relating to the guarantee of bank deposits, publicly before election of campaign contributions, and the trusts.

The two latter topics furnished him the theme for his speech. In the final analysis, the president and Judge Taft, the Standard Oil company and the steel trust, through Messrs. Rockefeller and Carnegie, were credited with furnishing the funds for the Republican campaign. Earlier in the day Mr. Bryan gave out a statement of his views regarding the declarations of the two financiers that they were supporting the Republican candidate and this statement was practically embodied in his speeches here tonight.

Not content with his strictures upon those named, Mr. Bryan had something to say about Secy. Root, who is credited with having stated that Mr. Bryan's election would be a menace to the country.

"I see Mr. Root has made an argument against the election of senators by the people," he remarked. "I am not surprised. No man in public life has more reason to fear an election at which the people vote."

"He also thinks my election would be a menace to the country. That is not surprising. He began his legal career with a defense of 'Boss' Tweed and has been so intimately associated with the big lawbreakers ever since that he would naturally resent the Democratic idea of enforcing the law impartially against offenders."

Today's journey through the state was but a repetition of the visit a week ago. Great demonstrative crowds turned out everywhere to greet Mr. Bryan. At Bowling Green, however, Mr. Bryan was subjected to repeated interruption by a man in the crowd who insisted on an explanation of how the unemployed of the country would be benefited by a reduction of the tariff.

### MRS. WILLIAM ASTOR, SOCIETY LEADER, DEAD

New York, Oct. 30.—Mrs. William Astor, who for 30 years had been regarded as the social leader of New York, died tonight of heart disease at her home, 215 Fifth avenue, after nearly four weeks' illness. Mrs. Astor, who was 82 years old, had been in a critical condition, owing to the return of a heart affection that had given her trouble for years. She was born in England, and had been in a critical condition up to a year ago, when falling health compelled her to retire into comparative seclusion.

It was in 1907 that Mrs. Astor's friends learned of her ill health. While she was abroad last year, her son, John Jacob Astor, made the announcement that Beechwood, the summer home of Mrs. Astor at Newport, would not be opened, and this led to the discovery that she was in poor health. Word came later from Mrs. Astor, who was in Paris, saying that she would open her Newport villa, after all, and that she would make the season there one of the gayest in years. This promise was not fulfilled, however, for when she came back from abroad she broke down in Boston and had to return to New York. She remained at her home since.

The society functions given and presided over by Mrs. Astor were among the most brilliant on record. It is said that the ballroom in the mansion on Fifth avenue would accommodate 1,000 people. Mrs. Astor was an accomplished pianist and a well-to-do merchant. She was married to William Astor on Sept. 23, 1852.

John Jacob Astor was their only son. There were four daughters, two of whom, Mrs. Ogilvie Haig and Mrs. Orme Wilson, are now living. The eldest daughter, Miss Emily Astor, who married J. J. Van Alen, died some years ago, as did Miss Helen Astor, who married James Roosevelt.

### PHILIPPINE FORTIFICATIONS.

Washington, Oct. 31.—The ordering of four additional companies of coast artillery to the Philippines marks substantial progress in the work of constructing fortifications in those islands. The national coast defense board estimated the cost of its project for the defense of Manila at \$6,168,819 and for Subic bay, \$2,348,199. The first appropriation for that project was made June 28, 1906, since which time a little more than one half of the work has been done. The entire work of construction completed in about two years if ample appropriations are made and as the work advances additional companies of artillery will be sent there for duty on the defenses.

### MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES

Marked Increase in Their Activity During September.

Washington, Oct. 31.—A marked increase in activity in the principal manufacturing industries of the country is indicated for the month of September according to the monthly statement of imports issued by the bureau of manufactures of the department of commerce and labor. A large decrease in the import prices of the principal manufacturers' material as compared with September, 1907, is shown. Hides and skins show an increase in quantity imported of 50 per cent in excess of the corresponding month of last year. Pig copper shows an increase of 25 per cent, crude India rubber 60 per cent, cottons for makers 50 per cent. While more raw cotton was imported than in September, 1907, the value of raw cotton imports for September of this year was a decrease of over 30 per cent. Similar decreases in the import prices per unit of quantity are noted in nearly all articles of importance used in manufacturing.

## PLANNING RACES FOR FAST AUTOMOBILES

New York, Oct. 31.—If the plans now being considered are successful New York will have an opportunity to see the fast automobiles and famous drivers that have been sent to America to take part in the grand prize race, without going to Savannah. It is proposed to have a series of tests of speed to take place on Long Island in which cars entered for the grand prize will try their speed against the Vanderbilt cup and motor parkway sweepstakes cars. It is the intention to run the cars over a two-mile straight away course on the eastern shore. The object is to establish new records for short distances. All of the foreign cars in the Savannah race will be sent to New York and similar prizes will be offered. In addition to the two-mile tests, it is suggested that races of one-mile and one-kilometer be arranged.
