FAILED TO READ PAPERS.

Maron Wolfsohn Reported Dead, and Life In-· surance Collected,

He Never Knew a Thing About it for Months-Strange Story from Chicago.

Chicago, Nov. 21 .- Aaron Wolfsohn surprised his uncle, S. Bleumenthal, a wholesale liquor dealer, by calling on him while en route for the East. His appearance at the Bleumenthal residence was unexpected to the last degree and his reception was as much a surprise to him as it was to his uncle and Cemetery Street sprinkling

aunt "Why, Aaron, we thought you were dead and buried," was the salutation accorded to Mr. Wolfsohn, when the door opened. "I don't look like a dead man, do 1?"

Mr. Wolfsohn asked, regarding his uncle's remark as a joke. Mr. "But the newspapers said you were

ead," was the response. Mr. Wolfsohn grew interested at once dead. and asked for information. In a short time he was made acquainted in a gen-

eral way with the report of his supposed sulcide in Los Angeles, California, last July, while a guest at one of the hotels in that city; of the identification of his body by supposed relatives and friends and its interment with fitting rites. It was all interesting to Mr. Wolfsohn
