

The new Toocle Valley railroad, which runs from the Salt Lake Route to the International Smelting & Refining company's smelter site in Pine Canyon is now within a half mile of operation at the plant. Mathewson, who is in charge of the installing of the new plant, declared that the work now going on at the smelter has put new life into the City of Tooele. He as-serted that the Townsite company and various other companies at the new Smelter city were doing an enormous business, as near as he was able to judge conditions. The smelter com-pany has nothing to do with the work pany has nothing to do with the work that is being carried on in the City of Tooele and the townsite company is an independent organization, backed by people from Salt Lake, Tooele and Anaconda.
