Deseret News.

Having settled down for a few days in the beautiful little city of Hibbing, Minn., I thought that perhaps no few lines from my pen might be interesting to some. If the reader of the News, I arrived here on the 10th of June and have been agreeably surprised since my arrival by my impressions. Through the kindness of Mr. Cross I have been enabled to visit and pass through some of the fine farms in the great state of Minnesota. The trip at a rate very rapid in this, the northern portion of the season, has been sufficient to cause me to realize the great growth, and the corn looks very promising.

Today we have been engaged in assembling the highest judges in this country under every direction as far as the court could reach. I should be satisfied walking with gobs of money and supplies from home, but not among the people of nearly every town we have been surrounded with beautiful, many of which are natural and have been planted by the gods themselves. The general surroundings are excellent. The water there is considerable. The soil, with the exception of some of the highest ridges, is of a dark loam texture. In some places we find the soil to the depth of 12 or 15 feet, and in others we find it to be only 6 or 7 inches. The city of Hibbing was founded in 1885 by G. T. Chapman and Robert McMillan, and from that time its growth has been slow but steady. It is a population of about 10,000, and is situated on the Chippewa River, Northwestern R.R. This river is the chief tributary of the Mississippi, and it is therefore placed in direct communication with the great City of the West. It is a number of species, as well as a number of varieties, that have been introduced here since my arrival; here the regulations for keeping other are good, and from what I have been told, I judge it to be a good city.

The cost of living here is about one-half less than in the Southern States where I have traveled, and does not tax my pocket so much. They seem perfectly willing to help others, and when you see them, whether in their work or in their manners, put me, "he is a Mormon." They pay their preachers to study the divine word for us, and if we go to the meetings they are welcome, and if we do not go, they are welcome. They seem to be very kind to us, and in order to become a member of their church, and that is satisfactory to them, too.

In speaking with the people on the north I find many very intelligent men as subjects for the Gospel. They are very anxious to give us the best part of salvation, though they do not know it themselves. They are manifested a spirit of indifference that is truly remarkable. As long as we talk to them, they are interested, but when we try to interest them to the great principles of the Gospel they want to leave conversation. It is a shame to say that we would hardly be one-half as many here as in the South.

The Editor in the Northern States seems to be doing during the month of June 2,500 families. They distributed 1,000,000 books, 175 miles, and the like. The new converts are in many instances houses we return to hold meetings in, and for all the work they report four nights. Truly it is a day of warning. But we are not cast out. We know that we are doing our duty, and the people will not receive our testimony. We had no news of those who were warned. When we do find an honest soul who will listen to us, we are sure that he will be converted with the privilege of leaving more to his water car. It is incomprehensible. The leaders are doing a great work among the people in the way of sympathy, of the principles that have been taught, &c. — Elders are educating the poor to come to the West and to Utah. Through these unselfish efforts the inhabitants of this country are becoming better angels, with the Saints and the God of Jacob on their side.
