Business was not very brisk on the exchange today, some 7,450 shares of stock being the number traded in for the sum of \$40,681. In spite of this, however, arises a real trend with a marked advance in Grand Central. A tendency to move forward was shown by this stock at the latter part of last week when it advanced to \$5.25, after hanging around the \$5 mark for some time. Indefinite rumors of a strike on the 200-foot level are current, but in spite of the uncertainty of these rumors the stock was traded in today at \$5.48 per share.

Daly-West also made a new record, having reached the price of 120 per share as it was predicted it would earlier in the year.

Con. Mercer sold at \$4.93, while Mammoth was a little weaker at \$2.34. Sacramentos brought 33%, Star Consolidated opened at 75 and sold up to 77.

May Day was stationary at from \$1 to \$14. Ingot was traded in at 3 and Yankee Con. sold from 20% up to 21%, but weakened to 20% at the close.
