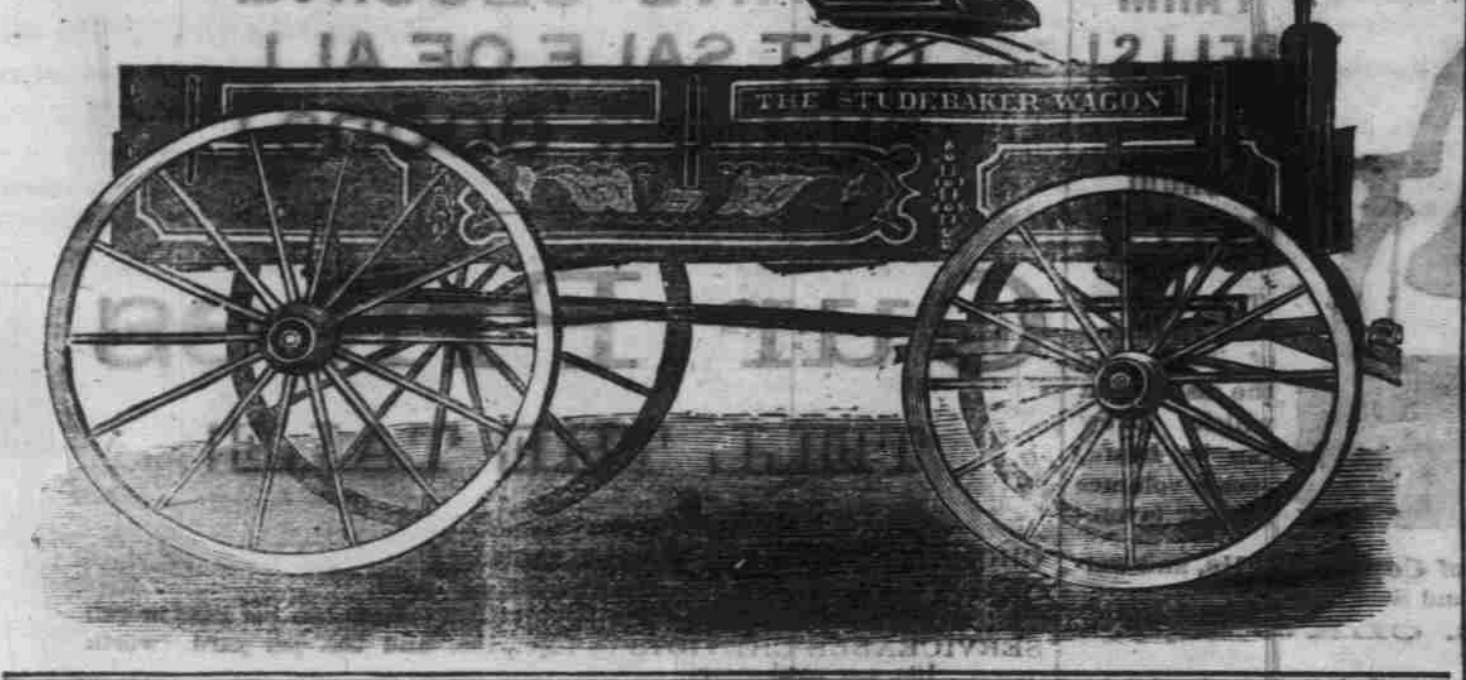

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

The Britanno yesterday brought \$1,217,000 in gold. Fifty-one buildings were burned in Plano, Texas. Indians are said to have killed 70 persons in Nevada.

A Beaver Falls dispatch says: Melton & Son's four-mills, Pittsburg, the mill works, and the Beaver Falls steel works were entirely consumed. Loss, \$40,000. Fully insured.

It is reported the steamer City of New York, of the New York and Hartford line, sunk in the Connecticut River, near Goddard's Landings. Passenger-master Sidney Bellew was drowned. Loss, \$40,000.

The hurricane announced by the Signal Service Department passed Port Royal, South Carolina, Saturday. At Beaufort the damage is considerable. Forty lives were lost, all colored, at Port Royal Ferry.

Mr. Stein, of Iowa City, to-day kidnapped his wife, who has fled with her children to St. Louis. His action was taken to prevent losing control of the property he believed her capable of disposing of.

The evidence excited by the court of inquiry into the destruction of the ship-of-war Doterok, in the Straits of Magellan, goes to show there was a lack of proper ventilation in the magazine and an absence of strict inspection by those responsible for the matter.

The excitement at Clintonville, Wis., about Indians has not abated. The Dreamers are still keeping up the dance. The latest from Keshena is that the peace men of the Menomonee have been arrested and agent Stephens with one daughter, are prisoners at the agency.

The Secretary of the Navy has received a dispatch from Commander Thomas O. Selfridge, announcing the capture of a torpedo boat, B. L. Edes, and Lieut. Lyman G. Spring, by the premature explosion of a torpedo this afternoon, at the torpedo school at Newport, R. I. Both bodies were blown almost to atoms.

MORGAN STAKE CONFERENCE. Held August 18th and 14th, 1881. Presidents W. G. Smith, Richard Fry, and Samuel Francis, of this State, High Councilors, Bishops and others, occupied the stand.

Saturday, 10 a. m. The audience was addressed by High Councilors Richard Rawle and Frederick Kingston; Elder E. B. Brough, who spoke on humility, obedience, consistency of conduct, keeping open the channel of communication between us and our Heavenly Father.

Saturday, 2 p. m. The afternoon was occupied by President R. Fry, Elder Jesse Haven, and President W. G. Smith. Subjects of the papers were: The Holy Ghost to comfort, bless and beautify; necessity of maintaining our right to exercise the powers of the priesthood; and the influence of the Holy Spirit in the life.

Sunday, 10 a. m. High Councilor Thos. Rich and Elder Joseph Meacham spoke on the sympathy and support we should render each other; our forgetfulness of God's mercies; and our duties in regard to Zion; should never express doubts before our children; but be faithful in them from their infancy; and need to rear skeptical offspring in the midst of the gospel blaze.

After the usual opening ceremonies the Sacrament was administered and State report read. Pres. Samuel Francis gave excellent advice to all acting in authority in regard to rendering unbiased judgments, and making amends where wrong has been done; that confidence may be produced; and mutual esteem established; that we should be free from evil, but was often devoted to unhalloved purposes. He believed in spite of our occasional indifference to the faith, the faith was increasing in gratitude, etc.

During the conference the wards were represented by their Bishops as being in an improved condition generally. Home and Sunday school were well attended, and other business transacted. Though not favored with any visitors, a spirit of peace and harmony pervaded the conference throughout. The conference was thinly attended owing to the prevalence of severe thunderstorms and freshets.

AN ORDINANCE LICENSING AND REGULATING THE SALE OF SPIRITOUS AND FERMENTED LIQUORS. SECTION 1.—Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City, That no person, firm or corporation shall within the corporate limits of said city, directly or indirectly, in person or by another, sell, barter, or otherwise dispose of, or permit to be bartered or sold, any spirituous or fermented liquors without a license first obtained according to the provisions of this ordinance.
