EPHRAIM, September 7th, 1889. Editors Deseret News:

Harvest is now in full blast, and soon the great staple of Sanpetesmall grains—will be in stack, ready for the threshers. The crops will be much below the average yield owing to the presence of grasshoppers the past season, and the prospects are gloomy for next year, as these pests have laid their eggs everywhere in our fields.
