XLVIII CONGRESS.

WASHINGTON, 2.—Yesterday afternoon a
resolution directing an investigation
into all leases of land in Indian Territory
for grazing or other purposes by
Indian tribes, the number of acres
comprised in said leases, their terms
and the persons or corporations be-
coming lessees, and the circumstances
under which the leases were made,
the means used in obtaining the leases,
and whether authorized by law.

Vest said he had information that
these leases were obtained from In-
dians by corruption, fraud and bribery.

Maxey, Harrison and others ad-
vised the resolution, and the proceed-
ings broadened into a general discus-
sion of Indian lands and appropria-
tion of lands for public use.

He said these leases of Indian
lands, while wrong, were no more out-
rageous than the unauthorized in-
closures, by wire fences, of thousands
of acres of public lands. It is a
question of the right of the people to
the possession of large land-owners,
foreign and native. He hoped the
majority would pass the resolution
and the committee would have the
executive officers of the govern-
ment, with ample authority in the
premises, and should do so.

The request of Congress that the
committee should report on the matter
went over for one day.

He said the new Senator from Idaho
had been elected, and the Senate had
reported the bill to the House.

The bill had been passed by the Senate
and the House had reported it to the
Committee on the Judiciary.

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THE MARINE HOSPITAL SERVICE.

WASHINGTON, 2.—Surgeon General
Hamilton, of the U. S. Marine Hospital
Service, has reported to the annual
report. He says: Forty-four thousand
seven hundred and fifty-one patients
were treated in the Marine Hospital
Service during the year ending June 30,
1884. The number of patients treated
in the Marine Hospital Service during
the year ending June 30, 1883, was
thirty-eight thousand and six hundred
and eighty-five. The increase in the
number of patients treated during the
year ending June 30, 1884, was seven
thousand and six hundred and sixty-
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
