

## FARM AND GARDEN.

OBSERVATIONS WORTHY OF NOTE IN RURAL AFFAIRS.

THESE HINTS CONCERNING THE TREATMENT OF BREEDING SHEEP AND THE YOUNG LAMBS A SIMPLE ARRANGEMENT FOR A TOUGH THAT IS FREQUENTLY NEGLECTED.

ONE MAN JUMPS OVER THE FENCE AND POPS PART OF THE SHEPHERD'S IN THE TRough AND ON THE LID OF THE PUSHING, REOPENING IT. ANOTHER MAN POURS THE LIQUID INTO THE TRough WHICH HAS PASSED THROUGH THE FENCE. IT IS EASY TO TELL WHICH IS THE WISE AND WHICH SHOWS HOW THE WISE MADE THE TRough STAND.



HOW THE WISE MAKE THEIR TRough.

THE FOLLOWING PERTINENT ADVICE IS GIVEN IN FARM JOURNAL, AUTHORITY FOR THE FARMER:

I HAVE GOT A BIG LOT OF EARLY SPRING SHEEP TO FEED THIS SUMMER. LOOK AND FOR THE NEED NOW. WHERE THE MONEY IS SPENT AND DONE FOR PIGS THOSE PIGS PAY THE BEST. THE MORE YOU THINK OF PIGS THE MORE THEY WILL THINK OF YOU. DON'T TRY TO FEED THEM AS IF THEY WOULD EAT THEM. LET THEM EAT THEM. GIVE THEM PLenty OF BREAD AND ONE EQUAL DOZEN. LET HER HAVE A ROLL OUT OF DOGS.

DON'T MAKE A PRACTICE OF BREEDING AND MASTICATING SHEEP. DON'T FEED BREEDING SHEEP AND PIGS. DON'T FEED BREEDING SHEEP AND PIGS. DON'T FEED BREEDING SHEEP AND PIGS. IF YOU DO, THEY CHANCE TO EAT THEM, THEY WILL KILL THEIR PIGS. DON'T GO TO THE OTHER EXTREME AND HALF STARVE THEM; BUT GIVE THEM PLenty OF BREAD, SUCH AS RYE, BROWN BREAD, ETC. DON'T FEED THEM ANYTHING BUT BREAD OR BROWN BREAD. THEY WILL EAT THEM, AND AT LEAST GET SOME MEAT OUT OF THEM.

THEIR PIGS HAVE BEEN PROTECTED AGAINST SLAVERY, AND BRIGHT AND GREEN ON THEIR BREWS IN THE ATTENTION. WE HAVE ONLY TO GET THEM FULLY ENTHUSIASTIC FROM IT AND APPROVING THE FLAG OF FREEDOM AND THE WHIGS OF FREEDOM.

THEY ARE NOT YET DEVELOPED THE TRUE INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY WHICH IS COMPANIED UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF THE GOVERNOR IN THE CASE OF MANY OF THE EXILES AND MIGRANTS WHO UNDoubtedly EXIST IN THE PRESENT ORGANIZATION OF SOCIETY. THEY ARE NOT YET ENTHUSIASTIC.

BUT NOW THAT WE ARE ENTHUSIASTIC FROM SLAVERY, LET US, BY ALL MEANS, LIVE IN LIBERTY, GO BACK TO THE STATE OF NATURE, WHICH SHALL RELEASE US AGAIN TO SERVE AND ENTHUSIASTIC, SAY, IN LIBERTY. HERBERT SPENCER.

THE DISPOSITION OF STATE OWNED INDUSTRIES, PROFESSIONS, CHURCHES, SCHOOLS, FOODS AND DRINKS, AND EVEN BOOKS, IDEAS, THOUGHTS AND IDEAS WOULD GROW TO SOMETHING MIGHTY AND GRINDING DOWN THE RULE OF ANY MILITARY TYRANT OF THE OLD TIMES.

THE COLLECTIVE ENTHUSIASM OF THE PEOPLE WOULD BE TO WHAT BETTER OR HIGHER THAN THE CONSCIENCE OF THE INDIVIDUAL. THE LEAD OF OFFICIALS SUCH A REFORM WOULD ENTAIL ON THE PEOPLE WOULD BE SOMETHING GRIEVIOUS TO BE borne.

THESE MEN WOULD HAVE EVERY MEANS OF PERPETUATING THEMSELVES IN OFFICE, AND THERE IS NO DOUBT THEY WOULD USE IT TO KEEP THEM FEET ON THE ROCKS OF THOSE WHO PAID THEM FOR IT.

THEIR HONORABLE FRIENDS DRILLED 500 POUNDS OF PHOTOPLATE, WAS PLANTED THREE FEET AND TWO FEET ALTERNATELY IN WIDTH, WITH ONE STAKE EVERY TWELVE INCHES IN THE ROW, AND THESE ROWS WERE PLANTED SEVEN FEET APART. THEY WERE PLANTED AGAIN LAST YEAR WITH ROWS ONE FEET AND THREE FEET ALTERNATELY, WITH STAKES TWELVE INCHES IN ROW, AND YIELDED 100 BUSHELS OF CORN A FAR SUPERIOR QUALITY TO THE YEAR BEFORE. NO FERTILIZER WAS USED AND THE CORN WAS AS GOOD AS IT EVER GROWN.

I CONCLUDED, THEREFORE, THAT I MADE A MISTAKE IN PLANTING MY CORN TOGETHER. TWO ONE-FOURTH ACRES PLATES WERE SELECTED IN WHICH I HAD NOT BEEN ABLE TO DETECT ANY DIFFERENCE IN QUALITY OF SOIL, AND THESE, NOT AND THE OTHER, ALL THE ROWS FOR THE WHOLE FIELD WERE PLANTED SEVEN FEET ALTERNATELY, WHICH DROPPED IN EACH CASE TWELVE INCHES IN THE NEW, CULTIVATED THE SAME. RESULTS THE FIRST PLANTED PROVIDED TWENTY TWO BUSHELS OF CORN.

THE SECOND, WITH ONE-FOURTH ACRES PLANTED SEPARATELY PROVIDED EIGHT BUSHELS OF CORN, AND EIGHT BUSHELS LIGHT CLOTHES, EQUAL IN SELLING VALUE TO EIGHTEEN BUSHELS GOOD CORN.

I DO NOT BELIEVE WE CAN HAVE ANY IRONCLAD RULE TO PLANT BY. SOME GROUND WILL STAND CLOSER PLANTING THAN OTHER. EASY BELIEVER CAN STAND CLOSE PLANTING IN MICHIGAN OR WISCONSIN AS IT CAN IN SOUTHERN INDIANA OR KENTUCKY.

## How to Grow Corn Crop.

An Indiana Farmer, writing in The Farmers' Review, tells us how he has gained his present success. He says:

The first crop with which I experimented for a premium in 1888, and on which I had drilled 500 pounds of photoplate, was planted three feet and two feet alternately in width, with one stake every twelve inches in the row, and these rows were planted seven feet apart. They were again last year with rows one foot and three feet alternately, with stakes twelve inches in row, and yielded 100 bushels of corn a far superior quality to the year before. No fertilizer was used and the corn was as good as it ever grew.

I concluded, therefore, that I made a mistake in planting my corn together. Two one-fourth acre plots were selected in which I had not been able to detect any difference in quality of soil, and these, not and the other, all the rows for the whole field were planted seven feet alternately, which dropped in each case twelve inches in the new, cultivated the same. Results the first planted provided twenty two bushels of corn.

The second, with one-fourth acre provided eight bushels of corn, and eight bushels light cloth, equal in selling value to eighteen bushels good corn.

I do not believe we can have any ironclad rule to plant by. Some ground will stand closer planting than others. Easy believer can stand close planting in Michigan or Wisconsin as it can in southern Indiana or Kentucky.

## Pig's Teeth.

A pig's eye may be known by its teeth, as well as the eye of another animal. Its mode of destruction is as follows. It is born with four front teeth, one month afterward it gets four more, one in each side of the first pair in each jaw. At 3 months it has eight front teeth, and at the front temporary teeth it has 12. At 9 months the four outside teeth drop out, and are replaced by permanent incisors, and the others are replaced during the next year. At 12 years the last teeth make up all of them to fit the jaws. It fully develops at 18 months, and after the age of 2 years grows longer. After 2 years the new front teeth have a blocking action on the base of the tooth, and as the age increases so does the color of the teeth deeper and deeper. As pigs, however, are not very long-lived, the last teeth, the last pair of teeth, are not often missed, of course, since pigs have been bred on to mature more rapidly, the teeth may indicate, as with sheep and cattle, more than the animals really have. A well fed pig may have all its permanent teeth, and the teeth of a well fed pig, if fed properly, have a much longer life than the teeth of a poorly fed pig.
