Contad Heller, a carpenter, testified to cutting out a portion of the wooden stanchlon of No. 1 scales. Through the hole thus cut, the government contends, was operated the steel spring that manipulated the weights recorded on the beam.

# ZELAYA PLAYING VERY FOXY GAME

Said to Have Evolved a Scheme For Resigning and Putting Jose Madriz in Power.

HE HAS UNUSUAL ABILITY.

Department Cognizant of Con spiracy and Prepared to Act Vigorously.

Washington, Dec. 2.—Driven to des-peration by the unexpected attitude of the United States, President Zelava is low reported to have developed a plan whereby he can resign and still retain power. This consists in putting in the office of president of Nicaragua Jose Madriz, well known in Central American diplomatic circles as Zelaya's enchman and declared to be at Zelaya's beck and call.

The state department, it is declared, is entirely congnizant of the conspiracy

The state department, it is declared, is entirely congnizant of the conspiracy under way and will act vigorously and promptly if occasion demands.

In the meantime neither the state department nor Nicaraguan legation officials will discuss the matter. Senon Rodriguez, charge d'affaires of the legation, insisted tonight that he has not heard from his government, and the state department likewise professed to be ignorant of the next movement of President Zelaya.

When the alleged plot for the continuation of the Zelayan power by proxy became known it threw the Central American contingency into a frenzy. One of the diplomats explained the reason for their perturbation.

"Jose Madriz is a man of exceptional ability." he said, "and one who could be extremely dangerous. He was plenipotentiary here for Nicaragua several years ago, but threw off his allegiance to President Zelaya, convinced of the necessity of putting a competent man here to look out for Nicaragua's interest, offered Madriz 315,000 a year to return to the service of that country, which Madriz promptly did.

"He signed the arbitration treaty with the other Central American republics and was appointed president of the Central American republics and was appointed president and Nicaragua was appealed to the court the only member of the tribunal who refused to sign the agreement was Madriz. His refusal, it was then understood, was due to the direct orders of Zelaya, who was anxious to test the interest the United States actually had in the contention and the standing of the various republics with your government.

"Now, It is plain to us here, Zelaya is desirous of finding a man whom he can command to put in the president's place. Naturally, he turns to Madriz, who has served him well, and with the exception of the one revoil, is to be depended upon. If Madriz finds his way to the presidency conditions in Nicaragna will continue the same as before, because the rule will be Zelayan, even though by proxy."

SECY, KNOX'S ACTION SURPRISES ZELAYA

Managua, Nicaragua, Dec. 2.—The action of Secy. Knox in dismissing Senor Felipe Rodriguez, Nicaraguan charge d'affaires at Washington, has greatly surprised President Zelaya, who reiterated today his belief that the Nicaraguan government was justified in executing the Americans, Groce and Cannon.

Zelaya will take no action until he
has received further information on
the subject and learned definitely the
intentions of the United States.

The American vice consul, Mr. Caldera, a Nicaraguan by birth, but a naturalized American, is still at the consulate. In the opinion of President
Zelaya, Caldera sympathizes with the
opposition party, and a close watch has
been kept on him, although there has
been no attempt at restraint.

Zelaya expresses the belief that, in
all probability. Consul Caldera's reports have been partial to the government's enemies.

FRANCO-CANADIAN TRADE TREATY RATIFIED

Ottawa, Ont. Dec. 3.—The Canadian senate has adopted the bill ratifying the Franco-Canadian trade treaty and it will be assented to by the governing one of general today. The French and Canadian governments will take immediate action to make the treaty effective before the first of the year.

The attention of Sir Wilfrid Laurier has been drawn in parliament to the fact that the consuls of foreign countries have a very indefinite status in Canada. He states that the matter is one which should be regulated and adds that it is now engaging the attention of the British and Canadian governments.

### FOUR MILLIONS FOR HOME FOR CONVALESCENTS

New York, Dec. 3.—A gift of \$4,000,000 for the founding of a home for convalescents in this city becomes available with the death in New York last night of John Masterson Burke, one of America's little known millionalres. The gift, one of the largest of its kind ever made, first became known in 1902, when Mr. Burke announced the organization of a board of trustees who are said to receive upon his death property, valued at \$4,000,000, "which they were to spend for the institution and maintenance of a home for convalescents, as a memorial to his mother, Winifred Burke."
