Utah that can maintain with the Turk except Russia. When the latter enters into such compact, there may protest, but will not attempt to prevent it by force; for all have learned in the history of several centuries that the power which assails the Moslem in his own land always may best him, but he is always the best of when the fight is over. He feels that he is in a position to maintain his position in the Middle East by way of the Dardanelles, and he is doing it. This program is sure to bring about a vast change in European affairs, and under present conditions is a menace to Russia, who is virtually without an ally in any point against such encroachments.

But while there is an apparent development from Russia into the Ottoman empire, there is a not less important evolution from the standpoint of British destiny. The columns of the North may gain his point with Turkey, and make the Moslem subject of the Ottoman dynasty; but the English will not be left out in the cold in any change that may take place in the Orient. Russia has vital interests there, and there is not the slightest suggestion in all her past or her present that intimates their relinquishment, although their maintenance in a new form is a possibility or even probability.

Whatever view we may take of a possible but extremely improbable conflict between England and the United States, wherein the former would be overthrown by a country superior in resources and situation, and in the physical strength of practically the same race of people, the relation between Britain and other European powers on the one hand, and Russia on the other, is unalterable. Great Britain has the brains, the money, the resources, the courage and energy which hold her in the lead. No two nations combined can overtake her on her own soil, and against all comers she will maintain her supremacy as long as her people are united; and as far as an aggressive war is concerned, she is a very uncomfortable antagonist against any other European nation in its own borders. With Russia alone would she fall in making war, and even then she would leave a lasting impression in a conflict at sea; this conflict will remain as long as Russia is practically a land-locked nation.

Let it be supposed that which now appears a possibility will come to pass, and Turkey be permanently annexed to Britain. This would mean a great conflict in which British mastery over the sea on the coast of the eastern hemisphere at least would play an important part. Her navy can overwhelm the combined navies of Europe on the Mediterranean, and in any readjustment of territorial lines there she will take her share. Her way to India by that route must be kept open. In the event of trouble that threatened interference therein, she would have the way with such unimpaired signs as would be sufficient warning to all other powers to leave that road clear.

With control of Egypt on one side, and with Syria on the other, either as a neutral power, with English support or under English sovereignty, she would maintain her interests, financial and otherwise, with some to say her way. There is no combination which European powers are in a position to make that will keep Britain out of the eastern Mediterranean as a dominating influence, at least until there is a complete readjustment of national affairs which does not appear in sight at present; she will hold her place, and it may not be necessary to fight Russia to do so, either.

All the movements telegraphed on the Russo-Turkish alliance seem to regard it in a serious manner as against Great Britain, and in doing so appear to forget the characteristic infidelity of the Turk. The whole history of his nation is that he is true to no alliance and shies no compact when he sees a chance to break it for his own advantage. He is a wily, unscrupulous politician, playing for his own ends. In the arms of Russia today, he would sell out to any other power tomorrow if a higher price were offered. The Russian trade him in more than does the Englishman; and in this very fact is the probability that he will soon reach the end of his rope that ought to be near, and between Russia on one side and Britain on the other will be carried through the sailing process that will open Syria, with the Holy Land, to a more liberal and enlightened government than that which has been since the Roman yoke was placed on the neck of Judah.

LYNCHING.

To the horrible details, and to the number of lynchings committed during the year 1895 in the United States, more newspaper attention was directed than toward the same class of crimes in any other year in our history. This inquiry is to be regarded as indicating a proper and desirable condition of public sentiment, for the records show that, at least in number, cases of lynching have been steadily decreasing during the last three years. There were ten less in 1894 than in 1893, and nineteen less in 1895 than in 1894, the number last year being 171.

But past experience unfortunately reveals that periods of decrease in this form of murderous lawlessness have generally been followed by the other extreme. In 1893 only 127 lynchings are reported, but the next year there were 192, and in 1894, 235; and there were 423 in 1895.

from analogy are therefore almost as good as a guarantee to expect a jump to 200 or over next year, quite as much so, at least, as a drop to a lower number than last year's record shows. The total number of mob murders in the United States in the years beginning with 1885 and ending with 1895 is 1,877, which is a starting point on our civilization.

As to the record of last year, it is worthy of note that in twenty-seven of the forty-four states there were no lynchings at all, and that the only states north of Mason and Dixon's line in which mob law ruled were California, Colorado, Illinois, Kansas, Maryland, Nebraska, South Dakota and Washington. Utah was then classed as a Territory, but happily did not contribute a case of the twelve lynchings charged against the territories. Still more notable is the fact—and it ought to be borne in mind by and modify the expressions of instructors and writers who discuss this great national disgrace—that in what are called the northern states there has been an increase in lynchings of ten over those in 1893 and of three over those in 1894, the number for 1895 being 27.

Language is not fairly capable of expressing the horror and the shame with which law-abiding people regard these outrages upon order and civilization. They constitute one of the darkest blots upon American history; and much of our boasted advancement will properly excite a shiver from foreign observers until we shall be able to eradicate the hideous fact that each year an average of two hundred human beings are lawlessly murdered by infuriated mobs of their fellow citizens.

READING AND PROGRESS.

The last issue of the *Deseret*, *Field* and *Farm* gives the acquaintance of the West a lecture on the reading habit. It points out that farmers as a class, and in proportion to their numbers, do not provide themselves with reading matter relating to their special vocations like professional men and those engaged in other callings.
