A correspondent of the American Agriculturist furnishes this recipe for making soap:

For one barrel of soap, pour into a strong barrel four patent pounds of lye that will bear up an egg; add thirty pounds of melted grease (previously tried and strained), and mix well together. Let it stand a few hours and then stir thoroughly. As soon as the soap begins to thicken, add weak lye, one or two barrels at a time, until the barrel is full. Be sure to stir the soap thoroughly each time the lye is added, and afterward stir once or twice daily for three days.
