"The Mormon Church in Utah has illustrated the worst features of eclesiasticism. Its policy has aimed at the control of vast wealth and great revenues, and this has been done, not by the acquisition of church property, in the sense in which other communions get and use what is needed for carry-ing out the ordinances or doing the spiritual work of a religious body. The Mormon Church is engaged in commercial enterprises and manufaciring. It owns and operates mines, farms, stock ranches and operates mines, farms, stock ranches and perhaps raii-roads. It is an actual competitor with individuals in nearly every avenue of business. Using its position as spiritual director it is an immense boycotter. It compels its members in the placing of their trade members in the placing of their trade, and is able to prevent Gentiles from entering into many of the ordinary in-dustries in Utah."
