Forty Feet Deep in the Streets  
of Brisbane.

## MANY HOMES DESTROYED.

Trouble Again Faced at Johnstown  
and Other Places.

## AN ICE GORGE BREAKS.

A Flood in South Africa Caused by  
the Overflowing of  
Creeks.

BRISBANE, Feb. 7.—The water is forty feet deep in the principal streets of the city tonight, and in the suburbs several buildings stand high. Five hundred houses have been demolished. Hundreds of families have lost their homes and left the city in boats to seek shelter on higher ground. All the gas and water pipes have been destroyed and the city is in darkness. The government came to the city in a boat today. He says all the towns between Brisbane and Ipswich are submerged. This is the greatest disaster in the history of the colony.

## THE FLOODS IN THE EAST.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Feb. 7.—The flood that threatened to sweep Pittsburgh and surrounding cities, it is thought, has been checked by cold weather, and at midnight the worst is believed to be over. The lower parts of Allegheny and the main side are submerged. The damage so far is known is not large, but poor provision for the safety of the people living in the city is suffering greatly from cold. The high waters seriously affected the railroads, and nearly all through trains are delayed. The famous Conemaugh is swollen so it has broken over the embankments at several places, causing landslides. A number of houses which stand along the stream, Tarentum, are expected at Johnstown. Turkey creek is a raging torrent.

Credit thirty miles of telegraph lines on the Franklin division of the Lake Erie road were destroyed by last night's storm.

Two small stations, buildings on the Pittsburgh & Lake Erie road, were carried bodily away by the flood. Dispatches from various points throughout the state were suspended. The railroad company indicated a general condition of affairs.

At Old City, Pittsburg, Warren and Prentiss report the Allegheny, the slate is submerged and the water is still rising. Many people are compelled to move to higher houses and others, with interests at stake, are remaining up all night to watch the rise. At Greenville the prospects are that great damage will be done before daylight by high water. At Newell, an important town 50 miles from the Ohio and the water has come down in a body eight feet high, completely flooding the lower portion of the city. Several houses were swept away and many families were taken from the houses. The damage was estimated at thousands of dollars. At Franklin a gorged bridge tonight and carried away a number of county bridges.

PLUMES IN BUFFALO.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Feb. 7.—There is a flood in South Buffalo, caused by the overflowing of creeks. Water covers the land to the depth of two and three feet.

## AN UNKNOWN DISEASE.

Students Become Suddenly Ill and Die—strange symptoms.

At Lexington, Ky., Feb. 7.—Fred H. White, a young man, a student at the college of physicians and surgeons, was taken suddenly ill at a lecture Thursday and died within twenty-four hours. His symptoms were so peculiar that the doctors could not sign a death certificate until advised to do so by the health department and gave cause for the same.

Friday George Hindman of Kentucky was seized with similar symptoms to those of White, and died this morning. Robert David Brown was also ill apparently the same disease and died this afternoon.

In all three cases the attending physicians were unable to determine the exact cause of death, and referred the matter to the health department. Dr. W. C. Gandy, who is investigating the suspicious nature of the cases, said: "The cases show their formulation manifested symptoms of a character that caused grave doubts as to the possibility of the existence of certain diseases, and they were removed from the hospital without any definite diagnosis."

The doctors, based on an official investigation, for the purpose of determining the exact identity of so vital a point, Mr. Gandy says, Student White's death was malignant scarlet fever.

Among the students the sickness has caused widespread consternation. After White's death the college was closed and the men began leaving for home. The students express the belief that his disease, whatever it may be, was caught from a man in the dissecting room.

The Panama Affair.

PARIS, Feb. 7.—Late this afternoon it was announced that Ex-Deputy Gibson had been committed for trial. Senator G. W. McCarty, of St. Louis, ex-conscript, judicial supervisor of the Panama canal company, a check for \$2,000 francs, the amount credited to him on the Theatre Commerciale account, was delivered to him in 1888.
