

STATE LEGISLATURE.

Bills Introduced for State Mining Board and Board of Labor.

AGAINST EXCESSIVE SALARIES.

The Printing Committee has a Bill—Land Commissioners' Question—Again the Libel Law.

The thirty-first day of the State Legislature expired today, with the members busy at work of general interest, but affording nothing of an exciting character. The attendance of spectators was very meager in both branches.

THE SENATE.

At the opening of the Senate session this afternoon, prayer was offered by Senator Zumbel.

Allison was excused for the day and tomorrow, as he had important business requiring his presence in Ogden. Jones was excused from this afternoon's session because of business in court.

Two court proceedings in cases in the printed copies of the minutes were gone through, and regular business was proceeded with.

H. R. 42, signed by the President of the Senate and sent to the Governor.

A communication from J. R. Lathrop, of the Utah Commission, was read, stating that he had forwarded to the Senate twenty-five copies of the last report of the Utah Commission. It includes the enabling act and the mine constitution.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

Reynolds presented Judiciary committee report as follows:

On H. R. 37, amending sections 5110 to 5201, Compiled Laws of 1895, relating to trial in district courts, with amendments, and recommended its passage.

On H. R. 38, relating to the trial of cases by judges pro tem, recommending its passage.

Miller, of joint printing committee, said the committee had submitted a bill on printing and the money would be here soon for the bill to be introduced in regular form.

MILLS INTRODUCED.

Chambers introduced a bill for an act providing for a State mining board and inspection of coal mines. H. R. 39, committee on mines. It provides a board of five, one of whom shall be a mining engineer, two shall be miners, and two shall be citizens. The term of office is four years. The board shall pass on the qualifications of inspectors of coal mines, who shall be a person of fair character and of good reputation, 25 years of age, and with five years' practical experience in coal mines. Many regulations for working coal mines are prescribed in this bill. It includes children or women working in a mine, but allows them to be employed in a clerical capacity. The inspector of mines is to be \$1,500 salary and five cents per mile for each mile traveled. No provision is made for the salary of members of the board.

Smith introduced H. R. 40, for State board of labor and arbitration, committee on labor.

It provides for the appointment by the Governor of three persons, not more than two of whom shall be of one party, as a State board of labor, arbitration and conciliation for the investigation and settlement of differences between employers and labor. The members are to serve for three years, except two of the first board, who shall hold office for one and two years respectively, thus making a new member come in on the 1st of January of each year. The bill aims to prevent strikes, and to settle disputes between employers and employees in all cases where there are ten employees or more. The members of the board are to be paid \$1,000 per year and traveling expenses.

LIBEL LAW AMENDED.

H. R. 41, the libel law, was taken up, and further amendments made. Warner said he wanted to give newspapers all the rights they were entitled to, but he was opposed to the bill now under consideration. This bill allowed newspapers to be malicious, without a remedy. It should include an article in the law, and that an article in which could be considered which would not remove the malice or injury of the original publication. He thought there had been and would give newspapers some protection under the law as it now stands.

Hathorn agreed in favor of the bill, because it eliminated the line of malice damages in libel cases. It gave only actual damages when any publication was made in good faith.

Smith also suggested the bill, because it protected newspapers who might be libeled. As an illustration of how easily a man may be libeled, he cited a Tribune editorial of many months ago, in which the judiciary committee was misrepresented and severely criticized.

Warner made a further suggestion to the bill because it changed malicious publication.

Chambers took the same view as Warner, and Hathorn continued for the other view.

Kearse took a stand against the bill because it opened the way for libel to be done by unscrupulous parties.

Allen Miller said he was surprised to see libel in the Senate as an ancient toward newspapers. Many legislators usually came from newspapers, and he was surprised to see the bill was introduced by a newspaper man.
