THE MORMON PROBLEM.

The Rev. W. R. G. Mellen, in the *Christian Union*, gives his views of the "Mormon problem," from which we extract the following:

The reader who is impatient for the practical solution of the Mormon problem, is disposed to censure the Governor for his dilatoriness in making a decision. He will find how perplexing is the method of treating it. Any reader, however, who really wishes to know the hindrances to its solution, can easily find them in former folios, may possibly find something familiar to that one, not wholly familiar to him before.

There are in Utah about a hundred and fifty thousand persons who have come to the Territory to admission into the Union as far as to solve the problem—wrote to the march of events, to trust the "Mormonism," despite law and constitution; and to legislate a "pure ballot" and "uncorrupted jury lists," and put "legal prostitution" under a social and civil ban. The first is the only constitutional and constitutional method of getting rid of Mormons in the Lord, if he is shown in the regulation that every people of God were commanded to do work of that nature.
