The mine and mill closed down nearly two years ago and a number of employees were left unpaid. The property of the company was plastered with attachments, and the late sale was the windup of the whole affair. It is said the employees will receive their pay in full.

PHILIPPINE MINING.

William E. Pearson Believes C.W.H. Will Have Some Good Producers.
