An atom of water sometimes makes a great difference in the properties of bodies. Morphia is commonly used to delay vomiting, but when morphia has been heated with hydrochloric acid, and an atom of water thereby removed, it is changed into the most active emetic known.

There is a rock in Jacksonville, Ala., discovered two years ago, that has plain cyphers of 1870 in large figures upon its face, and the cyphers are evidently formed there by the same hand that formed the rock; for it is plain to be no device of man, and equally mysterious, the discoverer being directed to it by a voice from a person that he could not see; and the voice said the cyphers were a living witness of the new era in the world's history, and of the terrible day spoken of soon to come.

The sugar crop of Cuba for the present year is estimated at \$3,313,000 boxes of 450 pounds each. The molasses crop will amount to 365,000 hogheads. Notwithstanding the distressed condition of the country, the actual amount produced this year will be about seven-eighths of the total products of last year. The smallest yearly exportation of saccharine productions during the past ten years amounted to 2,430,000 boxes, valued at \$35,000,000. A careful estimate of the saccharine products of tobacco, wax, cocoa, dyewoods, etc., of Cuba places the total value at \$80,000,000.

Spurgeon says to young ministers: "Avoid all pedantry. As a general rule it may be observed that those gentlemen who know the least Greek are most sure to air their rage of learning in the pulpit; they miss no chance of saying 'The Greek is so and so.' It makes a man an inch and a half taller by a foolometer, if he overestimates the bits of Greek and Hebrew, and even tells the people the sense of the verb and the case of the noun, as I have known some to do. Those who have no learning usually make a point of displaying the pegs upon which learning ought to hang. The whole process of interpretation is to be carried on in your study; you are not to show your congregation the process, but give them the result; like a good cook, who would never think of bringing up dishes and pans and rolling pin and spice-box into the dining hall, but without ostentation sends up the feast."

On leaving Orange, where he had been received with derision and abuse, he left his carriage, and enveloping himself in a Russian cloak, and wearing the white cockade in a common round hat, he rode on in a single courier, and during the rest of the journey repeatedly changed names and clothes with the common soldiers, who accompanied him.
