

POLITICAL MENTION.

Third Precinct Democratic Convention to Reconvene.

REPUBLICANS RECALL THEIRS
On Account of Hugh Anderson, Who
Believes He Has the
Race.

The past week has been a busy and eventful one in the circles of local politics. The meetings which interested between the 1st and election day will be more still and perhaps more eventful than the one that closed. Activity in its strongest sense is witnessed about the headquarters of both the big parties. In the Republican camp Chairman Cannon smiles the smile of confidence and says probably no height of the organization over which he presides. About the small cities of the Democratic delegation, Judge Powers, the latter continues to substantiate and unequivocally declare that "this is a Democratic year." The most interesting developments in the local political field since the Nov. 5 went to press last evening are the resignations of Hugh Anderson, Republican member of the City Council from the Third precinct, and the issuance today of an order reconvening the Democratic convention from the same meeting to consider the candidacy of Mr. Watson, also a member of Council chamber.

CASE FROM COUNSELMAN WATSON.

Counselman Watson has sent the following card to D. C. Dunbar, chairman of the Democratic city committee:

THE DEMOCRATIC STATE CONVENTION.

The following information has been received from Democratic headquarters concerning the State convention which is to reconvene on the 22nd instant:

The officers elected at Ogden will continue in their respective positions. The members of the Ogden delegation will be recognized as the badge of the extraordinary session. Delegates will therefore wear their old badges as none other will be issued or recognized. The official roll call will be suspended until the adjournment of the state committee, from the report of the committee on credentials made at Ogden, and it will furnish the chairman of each county delegation.

In the event of any delegate being unable to attend the delegation will fill the vacancy from the alternatives stated, or by the duly authorized proxy named by the principal.

Admission to the theater will be by ticket only. Tickets will be supplied to each delegation, and to the state committee on the secretaries of the committed Democratic headquarters on Monday, Oct. 21st, or before the hour of meeting Tuesday morning, October 22nd.

The chairman of each delegation will be entitled to a limited number of tickets for visitors from their respective localities. People desiring admission tickets will therefore apply for them to their respective delegations. Under no circumstances may any delegate be admitted to the theater without their chairman's ticket.

The number of delegates entitled to seats in the convention is six hundred and fifty.
