GRINDERS OF CUTLERY.


RESULTS OF INHALING AIR LOADED WITH IRRITATING DUST.

Dr. Canedy, of Shelburne Falls, Mass., recently read a paper before the Franklin District Medical Society of this place, in which he gave the results of his observations on the grinders employed by a cutlery company at that place, inhaling, on an average, 40 m and boys for the past 25 years. During the ten years just ended, 23 grinders died of consumption, 10 of the causes of the air passages, and 3 are now confined to the house with similar affections; and 5 in whom the disease has made considerable progress are still at work in the cutlery. Of all the occupations in which the workers are exposed to inhale as much as they are with irritating dust, as coal mining and iron and steel polishing, this seems to be the most certain or fatal in its effects than grinding.

Investigations made at Sheffield, England, fix the average period at which grinders can work at thirteen years. The first symptom which manifested itself was a cough, caused by shortness of breath upon such exertion as walking up hill. During all this time the patient was able to do his work, but the lungs, which result in a gangrenous or purulent condition; the patient is unable to do his work, and dies, though. During this attack the patient is confined to bed from ten to twenty days, and the coughing and spitting of terms in the lungs, all, when the phlegm is expectorated, improvement begins. As the coughing and spitting gradually slow; some of the patients live ten years or more, after the coughing ceases, and the shop by their cough, most of the time in chronic invalidism, and dying at an advanced age, and dependent upon pulmonary disease.


In spite of all treatment, the inevitable end of the disease is to be toward a fatal termination, and Dr. Canedy states that he has never known a case in which the disease is given in this paper is a
