WEATHER CONDITIONS.

The barometer has fallen over all sections except the Pacific states, plateau region and the extreme northwest, where the pressure has risen in the past 24 hours. The highest pressure was central over portions of the lake region, Mississippi and the B. N. W. territories, and lowest over portions of Wyoming, Washington and Kansas.

Precipitation occurred over portions of Utah, Idaho, Washington, California, Oregon, Montana, Minnesota and Manitoba. It was snowing this morning at Spokane, Helena, Miles City and Moorhead. The temperature has risen as a rule over all districts except the northern Rocky Mountain slope, northern plateau and British possessions, where a decided fall occurred with temperatures below zero over portions of Montana, North Dakota and the B. N. W. territories.

WANTS POSSESSION OF CHILD.

So That She Can Return to Mother In Council Bluffs and Turn Over a New Leaf.

Lillie Davis Maillard has appealed to the police for protection from her husband, August Maillard, who runs a saloon at Fourteenth South and State streets, and has asked the police to help her gain possession of her 4-year-old child, so that she may return to her mother in Council Bluffs, Ia., and henceforth lead a respectable life. She was induced to leave her home five years ago with Maillard, she then being only 14 years of age, and during those years she says that she has been compelled by him to lead a life of shame and has practically been in bondage.

She has been running a resort on Commercial street and her husband was running a perfumery establishment within a few doors of her place. On Thursday she fled from her husband and went to Ogden. Maillard followed her, but she escaped him and returned to this city yesterday and appeared to the police for protection. If she can gain possession of her child she will return to her mother and try to lead a respectable life.
