

TELEGRAPHIC AGAINST LYNCHING.

Run Meeting at Faneuil Hall to
Protest Against Murder

32. LAW-DEFENDING CRUEL MOBS.

Speeches by Congressman Morse and
Others in Anti-Lynching Reso-
lution Adopted.

BOSTON, Nov. 12.—Nearly 3,000 per-

son attended a mass meeting in Faneuil

Hall to protest against the

practice of lynching and burning us-

to death in Southern and other states.

The meeting was held under the au-

thority of the various colored societies of

justice and vicinity. The speakers

were both white and colored

and were vigorously applauded.

Major Curtis presided, and among

the speakers were Congressmen Morse,

Judge Edward Walker and Father

Hugh. At the conclusion of the

meeting, Hon. George L. Dawing

presented the following resolution:

"We condemn without any reserva-

tion the lynching, mutilating,

burning alive of men and women who

are lawfully tried in public court

as accessory after the fact, or to

attract the attention of the world. We

condemn the God-dethroning heartless

and callous conduct of those
