THROWN UNDER
STREET CAR.Little Daniel Davis Has His
Left Arm Frightfully
Lacerated.

IMPRESSIVE FUNERAL SERVICES

Over Remains of Mrs. Diana Fife Farr
And Moroni Skeen Sen. -Gov. Wells
To Speak in Ogden Memorial Day.

Daniel Davis, the 12-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. E. R. Davis, was seriously injured Saturday night by being thrown from a horse in front of a moving street car on Twenty-fifth street, about the result of the same may lose his left arm.

At about 8 o'clock in the evening the boy was riding down Twenty-fifth street slowly on his horse, when it became suddenly frightened and jumping to one side, threw the boy directly in front of a car, his left arm catching in the car some way, so that the flesh was torn from the bones. He was picked up and carried into Carr's drug store and Drs. Conroy and Forbes summoned. A physician dressed the injured arm and set the bone as perfectly as possible. He was then placed in a carriage and sent to his home, 221 west Twenty-first street. The doctors report that he is resting as well as can be expected and that they are going to make a special effort to save his arm from amputation. The horse on which he was riding was pushed along for some distance in front of the car, but received only slight injury.

MRS. FARIS LAID TO REST.
